

The Villages Daily Sun Featured Chapter 1236 Pres. John Carlile and the Build of the Pedal Mini Pitts



Pioneering aviator, Harriet Quimby died on July 1, 1912 after she was ejected from the brand-new Bleriot monoplane she was piloting.

Quimby was the first licensed female pilot in America and the first woman to fly a plane across the English Channel.



On July 2, 1937 at 10:00 in the morning Amelia Earhart and Fred Noonan took off from Lae Airfield in their heavily loaded Electra to their destination, Howland Island.

The pair and aircraft, would never be seen again.
