EAA Chapter 1328 August 12, 2023, Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order at 9:30 by President Bryan Swank

June meeting minutes approved as published.

Treasurers Report- hangar door expenses- \$317.88, current balance- \$3830.66

New Business:

John Reen was formally recognized for completing his private pilot check-ride as EAA Chapter 1328's first Ray Scholar. John was also presented with a Zulu 3 headset donated by Light-speed Aviation. Further discussions centered around the fact that obtaining a private pilot's license continues to increase in cost, making scholarships increasingly important to young folks aspiring to a career in aviation.

Despite uncooperative weather, our recent pitch-in lunch was deemed a success with over 30 participants and plenty of food! Discussion of possibly making this an annual event resulted in a motion by Greg Pittman to do so. The motion was seconded, and voting was unanimous in favor of an annual mid-summer pitch-in to be held rain or shine.

<u>Ray Scholarship</u>- Discussion included the opinion that two scholarships may be available to our chapter. More research on the process is necessary. Also discussed was the possibility of establishing prerequisites such as passing the knowledge test, and getting some dual instruction for scholarship applicants. Discussions were tabled pending involvement of scholarship committee chairman, Jeff Malcomb.

The hangar door project is virtually finished under the leadership of John Shoaf. Thanks to all who participated in this worthwhile project! Next project may be cleaning of the hangar walls. Discussion was tabled pending research on possible approaches to the problem.

RV-12 Build - Per Bob Kelly, "It is doing well as far as developing mentors. The students are doing well, no complaints." Bob announced there would be a training session next Monday evening on how to deal with epoxy and related materials. Bryan Swank commented that he would also like to finish up the tail cone with Wyatt Brooks on Monday, since that will be Wyatt's last night to work. Bryan also noted that the build is entering a transition period in which some students will be leaving, and new students will have to be recruited.

<u>Christmas Party entertainment</u>- Greg Pittman will contact David Graves to see if he might be available.

<u>Library/Sim Lab</u>- Bob and Glenda Kelly reported that the Library/Sim Lab is receiving finishing touches but is currently usable. All are welcome to put it to use.

<u>501c3</u> - No progress to report. It was noted that the chapter could be missing out on major give-away programs such as RV-12 aircraft and flight simulators without 501c3 status.

<u>Reminder</u>- The Jerry Brown Hot Dog Fly-In is Saturday, August 19. Bryan will be looking for a headcount. This is a rain or shine event and is held in conjunction with Columbus Chapter 729.

<u>Program</u> – Brett Herrick made an interesting and informative presentation detailing his experiences with the use of EAA Chapter 729's Dynamic Propeller balancer on Rotax 912 ULS engines installed in RV-12 aircraft. Topics covered included benefits, limitations, considerations, and testing procedures associated with propeller balancing. Several questions followed.

Meeting adjourned at 11:30 with attendees encouraged to stop by the Library / Sim Lab for a look and then check out the hangar door and RV-12 progress.


