Our chapter has several members currently building experimental kit planes in varying stages. The builders have been busy this winter and below are some updates on their projects. If you are building a kit, we would love to include your update in a future newsletter.

Chapter Member: Jeff Stolasz Kit: Just Highlander Build Location: Jeff's Home Shop

The Highlander is closing in on completion. Just today I did a successful first engine start. As with everything it didn't go without some head scratching. First, I had to figure out why the starter wasn't getting power. As I was walking to get my tools, I remembered...the anti-theft switch! I wired that as one of the first things six months ago, at least it's working. Then I forgot about the fuel valve. Definitely need to write that checklist. The third attempt at starting led me down another troubleshooting path to a mis-wired ignition switch. Finally, on the fourth attempt it fired right up. Now I need to dial in the prop pitch. All the major pieces are complete. A lot of punch list items to go through and nagging issues to fix. I think I can see the light at the end of the tunnel.

ODART Update

The Oregon Disaster Airlift Response Team Whale Run 2025 annual exercise – set for Saturday, June 7th and Saturday, June 14th is in its final planning stage, with pilots having just been matched to flights.

We will be flying "Windshield Aerial Surveys" on Saturday, June 7th. These flights will assess transportation infrastructure in Central Oregon and across the Cascades. This includes major highways and airfields. If you would like to fly-along with a pilot as an observer, a sign-up sheet will be circulated at the chapter meeting.

Bend pilots will be flying cargoes from airports on the west side of the Cascades to the Bend Municipal Airport on June 14th. Those cargoes will most likely be non-perishable food, and we will deliver those cargoes to local food banks in Central Oregon.

This past Monday, flight assignments were made, and pilots notified. Pilots - if you have not registered for flights with Air Ops Coordinator Dave Wellman, there may still be flight slots available. Contact Dave NOW at dave@wellmansurveying.com

Logistics volunteers, we'll need you on Saturday, June 14th to support the cargo flights. If you'd like to volunteer, a sign-up sheet will be circulated at the chapter meeting. You'll manage the ramp for safe operations, assist pilots with unloading, and forward flight arrival/cargo receipt notifications to communications volunteers for transmission to ODART sending airport comm's volunteers.

We have 4 volunteers on our communications team. And a complete HAM/PC station that can communicate with all other ODART locations, and beyond. If you'd like to join that team, we'll have a sign-up sheet for that also.

Anyone - YOU can sign-up to be an exercise observer! We are looking for observations of what worked, and didn't work so well. OR - if you'd like to deliver cargo to your favorite food bank, we'll make the arrangement.
