### **Guest Speaker Bio: Dan Eilers**

Our January presentation will be brought to us by Dan Eilers, a local pilot with an amazing flying history. Here is just a brief summary of his experience:

- Dan was a Navy carrier pilot from 1967-1972 flying mostly A-4s from the USS Hancock.
- 1973-1980: Worked as a NOAA pilot flying aerial photography in a DHC-5 Buffalo and Rockwell Turbo Commander 690.
- 1981-1984: Flew for NOAA on exchange duty to the Naval Oceanographic squadron flying P-3s to 32 different countries.
- 1984-1989: Flew P-3s for worldwide weather research (35 hurricanes, 3 cyclones) and DHC-3 Twin Otter for Alaska surveys.
- 1989-2002: Flew for American Airlines in numerous aircraft but mostly the 737.
- In 1992 while on furlough, he flew the DHC-5 in Africa (Kenya, Somalia Ethiopia) for Red Cross relief.

# IMPORTANT AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION

There are now two active Notice to Air Missions (NOTAM) related to the air traffic control tower currently under construction, further described below:

1. BDN 12/036 OBST CRANE (ASN 2024-ANM-836-NRA) 440535N1211154W (0.1NM SE BDN) 3580FT (150FT AGL) FLAGGED AND LGTD DLY 1500-0300 2412091500-2503100300.

In plain language, this NOTAM, number 12/036, has been issued for the crane being used to erect the ATCT. It will be located approximately 500 feet off runway centerline at midfield off Bravo 3. The crane maximum height will be up to 150 feet. When in use, the crane will have a checkered flag on top with red obstruction lights and generally operational sunrise to sunset. At night or when not in use, the crane will be lowered. Unless extended or terminated early, this NOTAM will remain in effect thru March 10, 2025.

A little more detail about the project status: Steel columns for the permanent tower structure is currently underway and will increase in height as each floor is added. These columns will be difficult to see when aircraft (both fixed and rotor wing) are near the construction site as the steel columns will blend into the horizon. Per FAA requirements, obstruction lights will be installed on two corners of the structure. There will be two areas of steel construction, and the lights will be adjusted, as necessary. Over the next several months the construction will progress to the full tower height of 115 feet. It is highly recommended that all airport users refrain from flying over the construction site for your safety and the safety of the construction crew.

#### 2. BDN 11/052 RWY 16/34 E 500 WIP ADJ 2412070100-2412070759

In plain language, this NOTAM, number 11/052, has been issued as a work in progress for the on-going ATCT construction through February 12, 2025. Prior to expiration, this NOTAM will be extended every 90 days until the project is completed. Project completion is planned for mid - October 2025 and is currently on-time. However, if there are unforeseen circumstances that can't be predicted at this time (such as weather or supply chain delivery issues), project completion may be delayed.
