FLYING START gets off to a.....Flying Start

On the last Saturday of April, our Chapter hosted a FLYING START event for a great group of 8 adults and teens interested in learning how to become a pilot. They ranged in age from 16 to 62, and from all walks of life. We had high school students, a farmer, a physician, a carpenter, and a number of American Airline employees who work at Redmond airport.

The day started with a dedicated crew of volunteers who came early to set up the room and prepare for our guests. We were lucky, too, as it turned out the Civil Air Patrol had been scheduled to use the same hangar for their introductory flights for new cadets. Alerted by Faye, I contacted Cpt. Bruce McLellan of CAP who very graciously moved his operation to the FBO.

Steve Bateman gave a presentation covering the essentials of the requirements to becoming a pilot and what the local options are for flight training. He concluded with a number of practical suggestions on how best to plan for and successfully train as a pilot. Then it was time to go fly!

The pilots, equipped with flight routes prepared by Fred Berardo and marshalled by Chris and Jeff, flew to either Prineville reservoir or down to Sunriver. And it was no surprise to see so many excited and happy faces upon their return. A day well done. So a BIG shout out to our crew, in no particular order:



Kit: Just Highlander

A decent amount of work went into the Highlander since the last update. The Instrument panel arrived from Advanced Flight Systems. I can't say enough positive things about the process with Advanced flight Systems and Dynon. They helped me design and layout the panel, supported many revisions and arrangements, and provided all the wiring schematics for the final installation.

I also received my Rotax 912 ULS from the supplier. I didn't find an engine hoist that will lift the engine high enough so I built my own. It was handy when it came time to unload the crate by myself.

Recently completed installs are the Instrument panel, Avionics tray, battery, and baggage door(almost). I seem to be following what some say when working with sheet metal. Cut one for the scrap bin and one for the airplane. This month's goal will be to complete all the tail wiring, drilling, and equipment installs in the body in preparation for covering the fuselage. I want to minimize the generation of cuttings and chips on the inside after the fabric is on.

Air traffic control tower construction update

After a competitive bidding process, five (5) bids were received. An apparent low responsive bidder for construction was identified in the amount of \$9.1M. Contracts and grant applications will be presented to City Council for action on May 15, 2024. Major project components include construction of an access road, utilities to support the 115 foot tall tower, and installation of a backup generator. Work should be underway this summer.
