

Work on the chapter's RV-12 has been moving swiftly. The wings, avionics, engine and propeller are all installed. It needs a bit of wiring work, and an inspection by the FAA. Our chapter has several members currently building experimental kit planes in varying stages. We shared some of their stories in our November newsletter. The builders have been busy and below are updates on some of their projects. If you are building a kit, we would love to include your update in a future newsletter.

Chapter Member: Gary Hood

Kit: RV12

Since my last update, the canopy was finished, the engine was mounted, and now the cowling is in process. I managed to get the canopy plexiglass installed without cracking it:)

The engine and exhaust system install was fairly straight forward, but this cowling is a real pain! I managed to drill two fingers which were not in the plans. The cowling goes on; the trim lines marked; the cowling comes off and sanded to the lines and the process is repeated about 20 times each day. I know there must be an easier way, but it should be finished soon. The avionics is next and hopefully will be here in a week or two.



Chapter Member: Jeff Stolasz

Kit: Just Highlander

The last update on my Just Aircraft Highlander was fitting the wings to the fuselage. Since then both fuel tanks have been fitted, installed, and removed. I made a wing rotisserie jig and began work on the left wing. The wing was removed from the airplane and fitted onto the jig. Trailing edge was cut, fit, attached and riveted. The left wing set of flaps and ailerons were fabricated. It took a lot longer to get to the stage where the flap and aileron could actually be attached than I anticipated. The flap and aileron were finally attached and I am happy to say it came out pretty good. There were lots of lessons learned on the left wing that I will apply to the right to make things easier.

Sometimes I feel that I should have built one plane for practice and one for flying.



The next steps are to mount the aileron and flap pulleys. Then attach backing plates to reinforce the openings in the eventual fabric. Total hours on the project to date are 186.

Still working on the fuselage tailcone. Have installed the turtledeck and drilled the holes for the formers. The forward former is ten individual parts. Now I have to take it all apart to prime and prep the pieces for final assembly. Hopefully starting on the forward fuselage next week.
