Local Aviator Likes Making New Pilots



Erik Edgren of Oskaloosa farms for a living, but his passion is flying.

OTTUMWA – Erik Edgren’s airshow performances aren’t aerobatic only. Edgren likes a little comedy in his act.

“In my opinion, the greatest comedy pilot who ever lived was from Albia, Iowa,” said Edgren who will bring his clipped 1939 Taylorcraft to Fly Ottumwa next week.

Edgren, an Oskaloosa native, was influenced by Albia pilot Dick Willets. “I grew up watching him fly at the antique airshow.”

The Antique Airplane Association and the Airpower Museum fly-in near Blakesburg used to be open to the public, Edgren said. “As a kid I watched [Willets] there and was enthralled.”

Later Edgren’s father took him to the airshow in Oshkosh, Wisconsin where they witnessed Duane Cole’s performance in his Clipped Wing Cub.

Edgren’s comedy routine features his alter ego Hobie Washburn who has had a little too much to

drink. Many people call the character the drunken farmer, Edgren said, but Hobie's not a farmer. "I am a farmer," Edgren said, "so I didn't want to be a drunk farmer." Hobie wears a tropical-print shirt and straw hat and loves his margaritas.

Though a summary of his act includes spoilers about the show, anyone who has seen Edgren perform will be familiar with the routine. "I'll have airshows [that] I go back year after year," Edgren said. "There's always new people."

Edgren's comedy routine will be part of Fly Ottumwa's Saturday and Sunday afternoon airshows, but he also plans to perform a strictly aerobatic act during Friday's night flight.

"The comedy act burns a lot of time," Edgren said. Sometimes he's asked to do something aerobatic only, and he does. "The customer's always right."

Edgren comes from an aviation family. His great uncle Hobie – Washburn is respectfully named for him – owned the first airplane in Mahaska County, Edgren said.

Hobie, unfortunately, purchased the plane right after World War I "before all the Jennies got cheap."

According to the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum, the Curtiss JN-4D, called the Jenny, was first built in 1917 and is nearly synonymous with American aviation in the 1920s. The Jenny was used as a trainer for the U.S. Air Service during World War I.

Large numbers of war surplus Jennies were available after 1918, and its affordability, ease of operation and versatility made it the signature plane of the barnstorming era, the Smithsonian says.

Hobie met his Jenny at the train stop and took it to the farm using a team of horses and a hay wagon, Edgren said. He crashed the plane on takeoff.

Edgren's father, John, took flying lessons at Ottumwa airport when he was 19. John began teaching his son to fly when Edgren was 6. By the time he was 8, Edgren was ready to solo using a custom seat and control extensions.

At age 10, Edgren learned spins and developed a passion for aerobatics.

Edgren, taught his son, John, to fly. John received his pilot's license on his 17th birthday, the earliest anyone can receive a pilot license.

"I taught him to fly in a stock Taylorcraft," Edgren said, "and my dad taught me to fly in a Taylorcraft." John will be with his father during Fly Ottumwa. "He'll be helping me out as kind of my ground crew."

The 17-year-old Oskaloosa High School senior will also attend Fly Ottumwa's Education Day sponsored by Ottumwa Regional Legacy Foundation.

"I'm just thrilled with that," said Edgren, a member of the Oskaloosa school board. "It's such a wonderful opportunity for the students not just to get science [information] out of this, but it's a great career day."

Education Day is open only to high school students through their respective schools. Students will visit Ottumwa's Naval Air Station and airport, will see a corporate jet, several stunt planes and the Air Force's A-10 and will meet several pilots before touring the Indian Hills aviation facilities and learning about its aviation programs.

"Tying in the education with this event was a no-brainer for us," Kelly Genners, Legacy's vice president of programs and initiatives, said last week. "It's amazing the number of students who have never been on campus before."

"As far as the show in Ottumwa, I am just blown away by the quality of show they put on last year," Edgren said. "This is even bigger and better. This is totally top-level stuff."

Meeting the fans is the best thing about airshows, Edgren said. "I'm kind of an aviation evangelist. You get the best chance to show how awesome aviation is, and to get that one-on-one time with the fans."

Edgren signs autographs for anyone, but he especially enjoys meeting kids. "I go out and walk through the crowds, find the kids, sit down on the grass with them. I like to think I'm making some new pilots."
