### **AUGUST MEETING REPORT**

### **BUSINESS MEETING**

- The August meeting was held in the Riverview Airport hangar meeting room on August 8<sup>th</sup> with 15 members and guests attending. The meeting began with a voice vote approval of the July meeting minutes followed by the Treasurer's report and voice vote approval. Total funds as of August 1<sup>st</sup> were \$5826.56 broken down as follows:

- Three guests attending were introduced. Young Eagles flights for the remainder of the season were discussed along with some additional letters of thanks form YE attendees at the recent flight academy.
- James Zeman had requested withdrawal as president due to commitments out of state which preclude his active participation. Three options were discussed. 1. Elect a new president. 2. Move the VP to president and elect a new VP, 3. Continue with a "president in absentia" and have other officers fulfill the obligations. By unanimous voice vote, the third option was approved. The remaining officers will fill in for the current president.

### **GUEST PRESENTATION**

Discussions as to what extent should EAA 145 participate in a project with the West Michigan Flight Academy (WMFA) were conducted. There were many comments and many valid points, both pro and con, on the participation of the chapter in an aircraft building project. The general consensus was that facilitating the introduction of aviation for young students was a worthy task. The mechanics of that participation was viewed as problematic. Many details need to be worked out and the availability of space and resources is extremely limited at this time. Again, consensus was that the best course is to begin small, with individuals with specific expertise helping when needed. As resources are made

available, the project could be expanded into a construction project in the near future.

On Saturday, August 15<sup>th</sup>, Young Eagles were flown from the Sparta Airport. A total of 110 YE's were flown with Chapter 145 handling 38 flights (Dick Foster 21 flights, Dennis Powell 17 flights),
