ORB AEROSPACE

Last month's Chapter 145 meeting was a visit to ORB Aerospace in Lowell, Michigan. A company dedicated to "building the world's largest humanitarian air force," they try to answer the question of how to use technology to deliver payloads anywhere in the world, even remote areas. This functionality needs to be scalable and affordable in third world countries, at the human level, not just usable in high tech environments.









ORB is receiving sponsorship from private funding for humanitarian needs, government support such as DOD, as well as missionary interests. The mission is broad, the needs are still being defined, the people to be served identified and the possibilities numerous. Great to see such efforts here in West Michigan.


