For example, in October we discussed sectional charts, particularly the meaning of yellow shaded areas around cities (areas whose visible lighting at night suggests an inhabited area). Do not assume other areas are therefore "sparsely populated" with different minimum clearances. Even the FAA interpretation of sparsely populated is on a case-by-case basis. Good discussion.


