## **WWI Dawn Patrol Rendezvous**

On September 22 & 23, the U.S.A.F. Museum in Dayton Ohio will host the WWI Dawn Patrol Rendezvous.

This two-day flying event of authentic and replica World War I aircraft is offered every other year by the museum and the Great War Aeroplanes Association. The event includes WWI living history re-enactors in a war encampment area, radio-controlled model aircraft, period vehicles, music and



a collector's show of WWI era items. The event will include guest speakers on WWI topics as well as many family hands-on and educational activities. You might also see our very own Mr. Garrett and his replica SE-5.







#### THOUGHTS OF OSHKOSH....

On Sunday evening, EAA hosted a Chapter Leaders Corn Roast to celebrate the grand opening of the pavilion. Nearly 450 chapter leaders from around the world packed into the pavilion to enjoy fresh, roasted sweet corn, brats, and hot dogs. Jack J. Pelton, EAA CEO and chairman of the board, spoke at the event, highlighting that the Camp Scholler Chapters Pavilion will become an important part of the EAA convention grounds. Ray and Penny Bowman, EAA lifetime members from EAA Chapter 106 near Boston, Massachusetts, supported the pavilion through a gracious donation and were on-hand to cut the ribbon at the pavilion's opening breakfast.





Once OSHKOSH was under way, multiple chapters had the opportunity to host their own

pancake breakfasts. In addition to EAA Chapter 38, Chapter 25 of Lakeville, Minnesota; Chapter 983 of Granbury, Texas; Chapter 572 of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin; and Chapter 237 of Blaine, Minnesota, each sold more than 300 breakfasts and earned roughly \$1,500 for their efforts.



The 2018 One Week Wonder is the second "One Week Wonder" project completed in Oshkosh. In 2014, more than 2,500 visitors helped with the construction of the first, a Zenith CH 750 Cruzer.

One week after construction began on the Van's Aircraft RV-12iS kit that served as EAA Oshkosh 2018's One Week Wonder, the finished product took flight on Monday evening, July 30. EAA Homebuilt Aircraft Council Chairman Vic Syracuse, took the RV for its inaugural flight and said it was an ideal,



uneventful first flight with no problems. "What a perfect airplane," Vic said. "I can't believe it took a week to build this. That was wonderful."


Terry Hallett - Hummel Aviation – Terry discussed the design of the Hummelbird
