JULY PROGRAM

EAA 145 will host about 18 young people from the West Michigan Flight Academy (WMFA) from 12 noon to 3 pm, immediately following the chapter's business meeting. WMFA creates experiences for students that helps build character and develops skills in communication, social, technical, professional discipline and accountability.

The July meeting will commence with the Chapter's business meeting at 10 am followed by a presentation at 11am by Patrick Johnson, founder of WMFA, titled "Transforming young lives through Flight". Mr. Johnson states; "Our purpose at WMFA is to give economically disadvantaged urban youth the opportunity to pursue a highly advanced technical career related to the Aviation and Aerospace industries".

At 12 pm, Lunch will be provided volunteers for the ground & flight crews. Tours of Riverview Airport to introduce WMFA members to A/C construction and experiential A/C will be conducted by EAA 145 volunteers at 1pm with simultaneous flight ops also commencing.
