PRESIDENT'S CORNER

- Young Eagle pilots are required to have the training and background check.
- Ground coordinators are required to have the training and background check.
- Ground volunteers are not required to do the training, it's optional. EAA has set up on-line training to be easy, it takes about 10 minutes and it's free.

MARCH MEETING - ENGINE MANAGEMENT 101

Bruce Whitman was our featured speaker, and he based his talk on Engine Management 101, a book written by Bill Ross, the 2023 GAA National Aviation Technician of the Year. The book is available from Superior Air Parts, through their website. The book covers topics such as:

- Choosing the right mechanic
- Extending engine life
- Oil change as diagnostic tool
- Keeping your engine cool
- Magneto maintenance
- FAA-approved Parts Manufacture Approval (PMA) parts

Bruce also added his experiences with engine maintenance, specialized tools, monitoring your engine performance, and understanding the care and clues to better engine operation.

PREPARATION FOR SPRING FLYING

Your Newsletter Editor recently completed his Basic Med certification using the AOPA Online Basic Med Course. The timing is for completion every two years, and includes one part (online course) taken by the pilot and a second part (medical physical) completed by my personal physician. This got me thinking of Spring flying and ideas to get ready and proficient for the upcoming season.

I ran across these three acronyms I have used prior to flying. They also serve as thoughtful ideas to improve my flying skills. Before a flight, it helps to review:

IMSAFE (Illness, Medication, Stress, Alcohol, Fatigue, Emotion)
 PAVE (Pilot, Aircraft, Environment (V), External Pressures)

• 5Ps (Plan, Plane, Pilot, Passengers, Programming)

Also, a coalition of aviation organizations (including EAA) has come up with a National Pause for General Aviation Safety. This initiative encourages general aviation pilots to dedicate 15 to 60 minutes over the next six months to enhancing their safety practices. Visit GAsafe.org to access aviation safety for content tailored to your specific flying interests. You can earn FAA Wings credit for this effort.


