## EAA Chapter 145 Board Meeting Minutes January 12, 2019

**EAA Chapter Hangar**: The chapter has a hangar for the use of members and their projects. The EAA chapter hangar has a reference library. We will be revising the contents based on usefulness. The hangar has most of the tools needed to build your very own aircraft. There is a Chapter Hangar Use form, with suggested donation levels.

**Fund Raising Ideas**: 42 members x \$35 = \$1470 which is short of the \$4055 expenditures needed to run the chapter. Fund raising ideas were discussed, and included: Cookouts, Pancake Breakfast Fly-Ins, "50/50" Raffles, Chili Cookout Fly-In, Poker Run, Camping event @ Riverview, Paper Lantern sales, T-shirts with Sponsorship sales, Advertising Sponsors in newsletter, Ford Tri-Motor flight sales, Griffins / Whitecaps 50-50 raffle sales. If anyone has fund raising ideas please talk with a chapter officer.

**2019 Monthly Programs**: February: Herb Harney – Yellowstone Flying Trip, March: Scott Dykstra – Vinyl Wrapping an aircraft, Dennis Hutchinson – Davis DA-2 Restoration for April - if anyone has ideas for monthly meetings please talk with V.P. Bruce Whitman.

**Special Events with other EAA Chapters**: For events with a wide interest (STRATUX DIY ADS-B, Aviation Weather, etc) we will announce this to neighboring EAA chapters. This helps communication between groups and aids in keeping the aviation-minded people close, and not feel isolated. Also, if another chapter has an event, we will not plan an event for Riverview. Multiple events around the area takes away the amount of folks that will attend our events.

**Camping Flights/Big Tour Flights**: the chapter will keep in contact Herb Harney and other area pilots to get trip locations and dates, then pass on information in the newsletter and on the bulletin board.

**Chapter Group Flights**: Fly outs for the group were discussed. This would allow aircraft with limited size and speed to participate in



the group flying activities. Destination examples include Mackinaw Island, Beaver Island, Watervliet camping, Charlevoix, etc.

**Oshkosh '19**: Bruce Whitman cannot coordinate chapter camping this coming year, so we will have to find someone to be the chapter coordinator. If there is no interest, we could lose our "legacy" saved spot that has been the home for #145 for so many years. Chapter campsites will be staked out in the order requests are processed. Chapters that wish to sign up for chapter camping must be registered and paid for by June 30, 2019

**Activity Planning**: Activities for the upcoming year were discussed, among those were Oshkosh Airventure, Young Eagle flights, Eagle flights, Boy Scouts of America Aviation Merit Badge Day. Besides the October bonfire and Christmas brunch, we talked about a Riverview Airport Open House day, and a Chili Cookoff Fly-In event.

There is interest from a few S.T.E.M. programs in the area. A group from Grand Valley, and a group from Rockford are looking to aviation and how it relates to science and technical fields. We would work with those groups to tell them the many career paths aviation offers, and the science behind the way aircraft are able to fly.

**Membership Directory**: we discussed making a chapter membership directory. The directory would help bring members together, and locate someone that has a project the same or similar to theirs. Or if someone has special skills that could help others (CFI, A&P License, IA, welder, etc). The directory would help knowledgetransfer and foster conversations, and help members get to know each other better. The directory would have contact information, aircraft owned or built, special technical skills, ratings earned, etc.

**Riverview Hangar Directory**: Discussion was had on the best way to publish the hangar directory of Riverview Airport. The directory allows people that have an interest in a particular type of airplane (RV, Cub, Rans, 182,etc) to find and gain knowledge on that airplane type (pros/cons, costs, flight behavior, maintenance issues). The directory allows owners of same or similar types to find each other and share ownership knowledge. The directory may be combined with the EAA membership directory.

**Other**: If anyone has ideas / concerns for the chapter, please talk with any chapter officer. This group can excel when everyone contributes. The group allows members to make connections with other aviation minded people, to learn and share knowledge in this technical field, to inspire and be inspired to move ahead with new skills or venture off to the next destination.

We want to thank those that helped with events and went the extra mile, we could not have done it without you. The Boy Scouts Aviation Badge program was well attended and we had good volunteers to make the day go smoothly. The Wings of Mercy, Grand Haven, and Greenville Young Eagles event are always hectic, but with enough people we manage to succeed and produce a good event.

These benefits <u>DO NOT</u> do not include free or discounted admission to special exhibits, planetarium, and larger-screen theater presentations, nor do they include museum store discounts and other benefits associated with museum membership unless stated otherwise.

### EXCLUSIONS


Science centers and museums located within 90 miles\* of the science center/museum where the visitor is a member.

\*This distance is measured "as the crow flies," meaning that it is based on the linear radius, not driving distance.




## **ADS-B REMINDER**

Like it or not, just one year from now ADS-B will be required to get into Class B and C airspace. Those rules say that by 2020, all aircraft will be required to have ADS-B Out equipment to fly in Class A, B and C airspace, plus Class E airspace above 10,000 feet but not below 2,500 feet. You'll also need it within the 30nm "Mode C Veil" around Class B airports. So in general you'll need ADS-B Out most of the places you need a Mode C transponder today–and you'll need to keep that Mode C transponder if you install 978, because radar will be the backup for ADS-B.



If you are ready for it now, uAvionix offers a few solutions skyBeacon certified - \$1849, tailBeacon - \$1649makes a really neat, supersimple to install unit that Bluetooths (I think) to your mode S or mode C transponder. You simply pop out your existing tail light, connect the power wire you alreadyhave in there, and drop the unit in place with the two hold down screws. It can't get any simpler than that. The unit is currently available for experimental aircraft and will soon be available for normal category aircraft.



## ADS-B Compliance for \$699?

**NavWorx** has introduced its ADS600-EXP Universal Access Transceiver (UAT), an ADS-B technology solution for Experimental and Light-Sport Aircraft (LSA) aircraft owners, which performs to the requirements of the FAA's ADS-B rule.

The ADS600-EXP meets the mandatory performance requirements of TSO-C154c for aircraft operating in the U.S, and transmits SDA=2 and SIL=2. The new product is based on the NavWorx ADS600-B, which has received FAA TSO/STC certification.

Optionally equipped with the TSO certified TransMon-SPE, the ADS600-EXP will interface with older transponders, eliminating any need to replace the transponder or altitude encoder, according to company officials. The ADS600-EXP communicates with a wide variety of display systems via Wi-Fi and RS232.

NavWorx is offering the ADS600-EXP for a limited time for \$699.

## General Aviation ADS-B Rebate Program

On October 12, 2018, the FAA restarted the ADS-B Rebate Program. The program will end promptly on October 11, 2019 or when the available rebates are all claimed, so act soon!

ADS-B (Automatic Dependent Surveillance - Broadcast) is a foundational NextGen technology that transforms aircraft surveillance with GPS-based precision. Aircraft owners should equip as soon as possible to capture the benefits of ADS-B and ensure they will continue to be able to fly in airspace described by the ADS-B rule when compliance with the rule is required by January 1, 2020.

Starting on October 12, 2018, the FAA will offer rebates of \$500 to owners of fixed-wing, single-engine piston aircraft based on their purchase of avionics that have received an ADS-B Technical Standard Order authorization and meet ADS-B Out rule requirements. The

program will run for approximately one year or until the funds for all remaining rebates are exhausted, whichever comes first.

## YOUTH PROTECTION PROGRAM



For those of you that fly Young Eagles or help with ground support duties, the 3-year renewal date is here. To renew, sign in to your EAA account. Then click on "My Account", then click "Go to Training" then select "Training Information" and "Go to course" for the renewal course.

These are the same steps taken if you have not gone thru the Youth Protection Program. All of the following persons are required to complete both the online training and background check. Both steps are necessary and the cost is covered by EAA.

- All Young Eagles pilots
- All Chapter Young Eagles Coordinators and Field Representatives
- Two-deep leadership supervisors
- Volunteers who will work with youth in ongoing programs
- EAA staff
