

#### **AVIATION RELATIONSHIPS**

So many of us have been flying for years, building relationships and influencing friends and family members. Some of us pilots are more visibly influential than others, but we all have impact, due to the nature of our occupation (avocation, obsession, love?) You may not always be able to tell how soon or how much you will influence a friend or family member.

So I have been flying for more than 40 years, and my family knows how much I love it. I have tried to spread that interest. For a few years my brother took lessons. My grandchildren liked to say they knew how to fly by riding with me. Some other relatives flew with me and said they loved it, but didn't dive in. Fast forward to about 6 years ago when my nephew from Colorado was in town meeting with his new employer. He took me to dinner and eventually asked me if I thought he could become a pilot!

That was an extended dinner for us, as we went through the considerations and complications involved and got excited about what came next for him! We talked about his needs for training, his costs, his ability to study while working full time—all of the things we all have to consider in his position. One of his specific concerns was the lack of flight training and independent flight instructors in his home area. He lives in Eagle Colorado, adjacent to Vail and near Glenwood Springs. He had a real insight into how he wanted to use his pilots license, and that included regional travel with this family in the high altitude Rocky Mountains, so we discussed the altitude and load carrying considerations that he would face. My best advice to him included buying the aircraft he was intending to use before training, so that he could learn in his own plane, under his own circumstances and have the familiarity he would need when he completed his training. And despite the odds—he jumped in.

Now Kaleb has had his second Flight Review, has amassed a wide variety of flight experience in cross country mountain flying, and has many hours of great air time to look back on. The photo below is Kaleb, my nephew, the pilot, flying his Cherokee 235 in the Colorado mountains with me—his very proud aunt.

This was a win-win. At this point I am confident my legacy will continue long after I am gone. My nephew's son is in CAP at KEGE and will be a pilot too!
