


May 10, 2025 Chapter 1570 Newsletter



Mr. Bill Provance came to the meeting and gave a very interesting presentation on aircraft accidents. Mr. Provance is currently the Airport Manager for KDNA, however, formerly he was a C-130 pilot and also worked as an insurance adjuster. He had many interesting stories and

anecdotes to tell. As an insurance adjuster, his basic job was to determine the root cause of accidents and recommend solutions

He told the group that the main takeaways, things that he believes would have prevented many accidents, include:

- Know the aircraft systems and their limits. Green is good, but a pilot should know what to do when the gauges are out of the green zone.
- Be sure and do a complete and thorough preflight, there have been so many problems could have been found on the ground.
- Review the airport information for the airports that will be used and be sure and check the NOTAMS
- Pilots should know their own limitations and minimums.
- It is important to review what to do in emergencies while 'hanger flying'
- Finally, Mr. Provance emphasized that it is so important to be 'proficient' not just 'current'.
