Considering the number of YE's signed up for June 1st, 2024 event, one could say June arrived like a lion. Over NINETY were signed up. Not to be undaunted with this Chapter 1610 record turnout, Trudi Amundson, as usual, had things under control. Seven planes & pilots were lined up. There were seven ground crew-chiefs dedicated to each pilot. She also had three "people marshallers" who helped escort YE's and theirs parents to & from the planes. And finally, a one volunteer was there to handle triage and crowd control.

Crowd control was essential. During any scheduled flight time, the seven planes could accommodate seventeen YE's. Assume, on the average, two parents would accompany their child. Since we would have one group flying and another group arriving for check-in, that meant the crowd could grow to as many as one hundred people! The Ground Crew, which included the 7 crew chiefs, 3 marshallers, and the greeter did an outstanding job.

In addition to just the sheer numbers, the Ground Crew had to "call an audible" when, after his first flight, Greg Jorvig's plane had to be grounded due to a mechanical issue. That meant adjusting the schedule for three YE's for each timeslot.



EAA CHAPTER 1610 LONGSTER PROJECT: STATUS REPORT

Significant progress has been made with the Longster project. As stated in the June newsletter, we have occupied the space at the airport...the old fire-station garage, thanks to KBRD Airport Management.

All the Longster's components were moved in on June 12th & 13th. The frame of the paint booth was assembled the following week, and one wing was mounted in the rotisserie.

During the second half of June, Rollie and Joe spent time getting the space cleaned & prepped in order to begin cleaning & de-greasing all the surfaces. This step is necessary before any Stewart System coatings can be applied to the wings and the fuselage.



The project ramped up the last week of June with the application of EkoBond (the blue-green solvent) to all the untreated surfaces of the starboard wing. This was immediately followed with the first coat of the UV protectant (gray solvent). Looking good, eh?
