Airventure dates 2023: July 24 – 30



The annual [Winter Flight Fest](#) will bring family activities and the popular skiplane fly-in to the EAA Aviation Museum on Saturday, February 11, from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m.

The day is designed for all ages and is a family-friendly series of activities through the museum and at its Pioneer Airport facility. Among the highlights included with regular museum admission that day:

- Hands-on family activities:
 - Wright Flyer simulator — Take the controls of the first powered airplane at Kitty Hawk.
 - Paper airplane launcher — Fold your best creation and see how it flies.
 - X-Planes — Create your own X-Plane and test it through various obstacles.
 - A Pararescue challenge where kids design a miniature parachute and test it in a wind tunnel.
 - Indoor model airplane flying — Discover what it takes to build and fly a radio-control model.
 - Clothespin airplanes — Make your own airplane refrigerator magnet.

- Airplane model building contest: Open to all ages with no entry fee, with divisions for adults and youth. Contestants can build their models prior to February 11 but must have their models registered by 1 p.m. Judging begins at 2 p.m., with winners announced immediately afterward.
- Skiplane Fly-In: Pilots from throughout the upper Midwest land on the snow-covered airstrip at Pioneer Airport. Museum visitors are welcome to walk among the parked airplanes and discover more about this facet of fun flying. Shuttles will operate from the museum to Pioneer Airport throughout the day. FAA Clarifies Charting Notice on Private Airports

The FAA quietly released a [“Charting Notice”](#) in September which declared “Effective November 3, 2022, Visual Flight Rules (VFR) aeronautical charts will no longer make reference to emergency value in private airport charting.” It went on to say that “Only private airports with landmark value will be retained and charted beyond February 23, 2023.” This raised concerns in the EAA community that the change would have safety implications for pilots utilizing VFR charts during flight planning and in emergencies.

The approximately 14,400 private airfields in the United States account for nearly 75% of the nation’s total airports and are indispensable parts of our general aviation infrastructure.

Responding to community concern, the FAA released a [follow-on notice](#) Tuesday, clarifying that the only anticipated change was the removal of the term “emergency” from the chart legend in reference to private airports. The FAA determines whether to chart private airports based on “landmark value,” and these criteria are staying the same as those used before the September notice. The updated notice concludes that “aeronautical charts users should not see a significant change to private airports depicted on VFR charts.”

EAA continues to work with industry partners to clarify this issue and will take the appropriate steps to make sure important airport information is not omitted on charts. We will update the EAA community with more information as it becomes available.

House Transportation/Infrastructure Committee Leadership Established

Congratulations to Rep. Sam Graves (R-Missouri), a longtime EAA and Warbirds of America member, who has been named to chair the [House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee](#) and Rep. Rick Larsen (D-Washington) who was elected to serve as ranking member. The Transportation and Infrastructure Committee has jurisdiction over all modes of transportation: aviation, maritime and waterborne transportation, highways, bridges, mass transit, and railroads. The committee also has jurisdiction over other aspects of our national infrastructure, such as airports.

Rep. Graves, EAA 619761, Warbirds 554648, has long participated at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh. In addition, he hosts an annual fly-in at Tarkio, Missouri, each summer that brings together aviation enthusiasts, GA organization leaders, and congressional representatives in an informal way to enjoy recreational aviation.

“One of my highest priorities is a bipartisan, long-term reauthorization of the Federal Aviation Administration and aviation programs,” Graves said. “As a professional pilot, I know firsthand just how important a strong U.S. aviation system is in connecting our large, small, and rural communities to each other and the rest of the world. Aviation is a major sector of our economy, and we must ensure our Nation remains the world’s gold standard in safety and at the forefront of incorporating new technologies into the system.”

In December, Rep. Larsen was named as ranking member of the committee. Rep. Larsen also has considerable experience on the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee and has participated in bipartisan activities in support of aviation. Larsen becomes the first member of Congress from Washington state to be elected as a party’s leader on the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee. Larsen has served on the committee since arriving in the House in 2001 and as the top Democrat on the Aviation Subcommittee since 2013.

“Congratulations to Representative Graves on his selection to chair this important House committee,” said Jack J. Pelton, EAA CEO and Chairman of the Board. “Having an aviator lead this committee is an important element as important matters such as FAA reauthorization are considered in this Congress. Sam’s flying experience and knowledge of the importance of our aviation system is invaluable. Also, congratulations to Representative Larsen on becoming ranking member of the committee, as he is also well aware of the requirements to maintain a safe and vibrant aviation infrastructure for all involved.”

Fearless Freddie Lund

Thursday, February 9th, at 7 pm, as part of the 2022-23 Aviation Lecture Series, Eric Combs will share the amazing feats of WACO test pilot, Freddie Lund. Although Freddie was WACO's Chief Test Pilot from the late '20s to early '30s, it is the stories of his exploits with the Gates Flying Circus and his dogged determination to put the WACO Taperwing Aircraft on the map that will have you on the edge of your seat. Combs will also explore his life from his days on a Minnesota farm to his enlistment into the 4th Pursuit Group in France and beyond.

Eric Combs is currently WACO Air Museum's Director of Operations. He is also the owner and keynote speaker of Eric Combs Consulting, as well as a professional development instructor with the Center for Teacher Effectiveness. Eric holds a master's degree in Social Studies Education and Educational Leadership, Bachelor's Degree in Anthropology, and an associate degree in Anthropology, Emergency Medical Services, and Industrial Security. While a history teacher at Fairborn High School, Eric received the Teacher of the year award from the State of Ohio in 2006.

Combs is also a retired Senior Master Sergeant from the 88th Security Forces Squadron, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio where his last position was the Force Protection Operations Superintendent. During his 20-year career, Sergeant Combs has been stationed in South Korea, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Germany, Wyoming, and England and has been on numerous deployments in the Middle East, North Africa, and Europe.

Eric is married to Elizabeth, and they have one daughter, Olivia, and two granddaughters, Sophia and Kaylee. In his free time, Eric enjoys diving.

All aviation lectures are free and open to the public and are scheduled to last one hour, beginning at 7 pm, with questions to follow. The center section of the wing on the Tri-Motor is currently being replaced. The airplane sits in the hangar with the engines, props, landing gear, and outer wings all removed to gain access to the center section.

The center section was removed and is at Hov-Aire, Inc. in Three Rivers, MI. Hov-Aire is transferring brackets, pulleys, and mounts before returning it to Oshkosh for installation. While this takes place, the EAA team is repairing and repainting engine mounts for reinstallation.

EAA's goal is to have the first flight after reassembly by March 31, 2023. The goal is to work on discrepancies, train, and get the EAA Ford Trimotor out on tour by June of next year. Donations to the EAA Aviation Foundation help make developments like this to our aircraft. We want everyone to enjoy our touring aircraft for decades to come. Thank you for your support!
