Virtual Meeting Options:

Since it may be some time before Chapter Gatherings and Chapter Board Meetings can return to full attendance, you may want to look at alternatives.

WARNING: You need to test run any solution you settle on before going live with your chapter. Too much can go wrong on your first try.

Our Recommendation:

- **Webex:** Now has a FREE plan that could handle a chapter gathering or board meeting. We have tested it and find it relatively easy to use and it allows up to 100 participants for free. Overall, we feel it is a solid option for a chapter meeting.
- **ZOOM:** We have tested ZOOM and find it relatively easy to use, allows up to 100 participants on the base plan and affordable. Overall, we feel it is the best option for a chapter meeting. You can start off with a free version that is limited to 40-minute sessions. (At the time limit, you can simply shutdown and restart immediately which could work for a board meeting). The Monthly subscription is \$15/month.

Other Virtual Meeting Options:

- **GotoWebinar/GotoMeeting** – Great platform that EAA uses for webinars. However, basic plan is pricey.
- **Google Hangouts** – Limited to 26 people – Free
- **FreeConference.com** – Free

May 21, 2020 – Following a request from EAA and AOPA, the FAA has [released a policy](#) that will make it easier for some owners of experimental aircraft to obtain special flight permits (SFPs) for their airplanes in order to reposition them for condition inspections.

Rather than requiring a full in-person "condition for safe operation" sign-off from an FAA inspector, which was previously required for SFPs, the policy allows DAR-Ts (designated airworthiness representatives supervised by a FSDO) with appropriate function codes to remotely conduct inspections for the certificates.

While EAA would ideally like to see more simplified flexibility on annuals and condition inspections during the COVID-19 pandemic, this policy will help many experimental aircraft owners, particularly those who have "out-of-annual" aircraft stranded away from their preferred maintenance shop.

"EAA continues to hear from members the need for other policy changes in light of the coronavirus' impact on day-to-day life in the United States," said Sean Elliott, EAA vice president of advocacy and safety. "We continue to seek every avenue possible to find relief from or alternative ways to comply with regulations, and this new policy is a prime example of that. It is a small adjustment, but it will help."

Given the special circumstances surrounding the cancellation of AirVenture 2020, we have extended this year's donation deadline to June 30, 2020. Plaques, bricks, and pavers will be placed this summer, and all 2020 Memorial Wall inductees will be honored at next summer's dedication ceremony on August 1, 2021.

EAA Encourages Caution Regarding Aircraft Registration Renewal

January 16, 2020 - EAA is warning its members to regard any solicitation they may receive regarding aircraft registration renewal, especially those that call for using a search engine to find the registration site, with a healthy dose of suspicion.

EAA is aware of several businesses — with names, web URLs, and logos that may appear reminiscent of a government agency — that notify aircraft owners of impending registration expiration (mined from publicly available registration information) and direct them to use search engines such as Google to find the proper renewal site. These businesses then buy ads from search engines to make their site appear first, before the FAA website, in search results.

Such operations add little or no actual value to the transaction and charge a hefty fee for essentially duplicating the same process that the FAA directly administers for a mere \$5. EAA members should ensure they are on the [FAA's online registration portal](#) before filling out information and entering payment. Unless a business is known to be reputable and offers a tangible service above and beyond a simple registration renewal, such as expedited processing or automatic renewal, EAA members should deal directly with the FAA. Licking County airport terminal too close to taxiway, must be moved

HEATH — The Newark-Heath-Licking County Airport, like the rest of us, must create distancing for safety reasons. It is not to prevent the spread of a deadly virus, but to prevent a deadly accident.

The airport terminal, maintenance building and hangar are too close to the taxiway, according to Federal Aviation Administration regulations, and must be moved or removed, at a cost estimated at \$2.5 million. The taxiway was moved last year because it was too close to the runway, but the new taxiway location puts it too close to the buildings. The cost of last year's project was \$2.6 million, with federal funds paying 90% of the cost.

Federal funds are not expected to go as far this time, possibly paying 70% of the \$1.1 million expense to demolish and build a new terminal building. The remaining \$1.4 million cost of the entire project will likely require local funding.

Terry Treneff, president of the Licking County Airport Authority board, presented the preliminary project design and costs to the Licking County Commissioners on Thursday.

"We hope 65% to 70% of the (terminal building) costs will be funded by federal grant process," Treneff said.

"The terminal building location is in violation of taxiway. The maintenance building is a metal building, but sturdy. The little green hangar is very old and probably cannot be moved. Probably be a demo."

Treneff said the construction could occur in 2021-22, but more likely in 2022-23, and the costs could be reduced.

County Commissioner Tim Bubb said it was inevitable that some county funds would be needed for the project.

"He brought us good news," Bubb said. "As a result of the mandated movement of the taxiway, the FAA has a certain obligation. This whole discussion started a few years ago when the taxiway had to be moved. We understood there had to be separation there.

"The bad news is that's not the only building too close to the taxiway. The tricky part is there's also costs associated with the maintenance building and old hangar building. I think we'll do what we can to be helpful." The terminal, built in 1975, probably needs to be upgraded anyway, Bubb said. The new terminal will be 3,500 square feet.

"Sooner or later there was going to be a new terminal there," Bubb said. "It's an asset and we've got to take care of it. If Newark and Heath want to share some of that (cost), that is fine too, but it's county property."

Kyle Lewis, Regional Manager / Government Affairs & Airport Advocacy / Great Lakes

Aircraft Owners & Pilots Association has told me that he was there a couple months ago and spoke to a board member, moving the terminal was the only way the FAA would fund it, and since it's 2020 and COVID rules in effect, the FAA is paying 100% of it! is aware of the situation and has been to the airport.

As the contact person for your EAA chapter, I wanted to share with you the most recent spreadsheet listing for the pilots and planes that have volunteered to fly one or more of the segments of the AirMail100 Centennial Flights project from New York to San Francisco. As you can see, we currently have 10 pilots signed up fly 7 of the 15 segments. Back in early March, it appeared that we tentatively had most, if not all, of the segments covered, then the pandemic locked down most the world's economy, including here in America. Since the planned flight date is now just four months away, I want to firm up the list of volunteers and aircraft. To do that, I need your help. Could you continue to share the project with your members and if one or more pilots want to participate, ask them to sign up on the AirMail100 website. Here is the link:

The form takes maybe a minute to complete. We ask for the pilot's name, the aircraft make and model they plan to fly, plus its N-number. AIRMAIL100 CENTENNIAL FLIGHTS PROJECT
NOTAM #4

Greetings Fellow Aviators!

We are now within just over 3 months of the **AirMail100 Centennial Flights** to retrace the original transcontinental air route from Long Island to San Francisco Bay starting Friday, September 11th through Sunday, September 13th; and I am delighted to report that as of this past weekend, all 15 segments now have volunteer pilots and in several cases multiple pilots and planes. Naturally, I am both pleased and humbled by the response the idea has generated. It has truly been contagious...in a good way!

I want to bring you up to date on a couple recent changes in the route. The weekend of the flights also coincides with the preparations for the Reno Air Races at Reno Stead Airport (RTS). On the recommendation of RTS airport management, we have now arranged to use the airport at Carson City, NV (CXP). Ken Moen, the manager there, let me know that he and his staff are excited to be a part of the project.

Then this morning, I got a call from Tim Connor of EAA Chapter 5 about our planned operations in Ohio and in the process he convinced me to move our Cleveland area airport from Cuyahoga ("a big, busy, fenced in, corporate jet operation" in his words) to the more recreational pilot friendly Geauga County (7G8), 25 miles to the east of the original Glenn Martin WWI bomber plant field. Although Tim needs to

confirm it with his board this coming Monday, I have taken the liberty of replacing the online sectional maps and satellite image [<http://airmail100.com/airfields.html>] of Cuyahoga (CFG) with those for Geauga, in rural Ohio.

Also, this week, at the suggestion of the Iowa Director of The Ninety-Nines, Minnetta Gardinier, we will be creating several commemorative vinyl decals (see design below) for the participating aircraft, airports, and supporting "Ground Crew."

Finally, we have begun our outreach efforts to involve youth in the project by having them address and stamp the commemorative postcards [http://airmail100.com/postcards/review_sheets.html]. The way it will work is we will distribute approximately 300 postcards to school age students within the community of the designated airports. They will address them to whomever they wish: themselves, family members, friends, teachers, mentors. The local coordinator (either an EAA chapter member, scout leader, Chamber of Commerce employee) will collect the cards and see that they are added to the mailbag as the volunteer planes come through their airports in September. Once the estimated 5,000 postcards arrive in California, they will be turned over to the postmaster in San Francisco to be franked and then mailed. We are looking for coordinators, so if you or someone in your chapter is interested helping, please let us know. And of course, we expect the local chapters to reserve some of the postcards for the members to address and stamp. We would like each participating Chapter and airfield to eventually have a complete set of all 16 postcards.

As always, thank you so much for your time, interest, and support. Join us. Make history.
