Longtime GA Advocate Sen. James Inhofe Goes West

Longtime general aviation advocate and EAA member Sen. (Retired) James Inhofe (R-OK) died on Tuesday, July 9, at age 89. Sen. Inhofe retired from the U.S. Senate in 2022 after serving more than a quarter-century and leaving a lasting mark on Congress and general aviation.

"Jim Inhofe had a remarkable, positive influence on the growth and preservation of general aviation as a member of Congress," said Jack J. Pelton, EAA CEO and Chairman. "His passion for aviation, as well as his in-depth knowledge on the workings of Congress, provided countless results that benefited those of us who fly. EAA awarded Jim our highest honor, the Freedom of Flight Award, in 2022, to recognize those accomplishments. He leaves a tremendous legacy, and we offer condolences to his family."

During his time in Congress, Sen. Inhofe had a significant impact on the general aviation community with his support of numerous key pieces of legislation. He was instrumental in reforms to manufacturer liability through the passage of the General Aviation Revitalization Act. He also championed pilots with the Pilot's Bill of Rights and BasicMed medical certification and was a strong proponent of aviation workforce development.

Sen. Inhofe was an 11,000-hour pilot and owner of numerous general aviation aircraft, including an RV-8, Cessna 340, and Grumman Tiger. He was a regular at AirVenture, attending more than 40 consecutive events, hosting his annual Congressional Forum, and updating attendees on his legislative activities supporting general aviation.

Before serving in the U.S. Senate, Sen. Inhofe served in the U.S. House of Representatives, the Oklahoma House and Senate, and as mayor of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Major Changes to FAA Mental Health, Cardiac, and Vision Policies

Last week the FAA released a substantial update to their Guide for Aviation Medical Examiners that includes major improvements for the agency's protocols for mental health, coronary heart disease, and some ophthalmologic conditions. The "AME Guide" serves as the main public-facing document for medical policy published by the FAA. In the following story, we will summarize the highlights of these policy changes by diagnosis category.

Mental Health

Among the most anticipated changes are those to mental health policy. For the first time, individuals with a history of certain "uncomplicated" diagnoses that have been treated by psychotherapy (including active treatment), have not been medicated within two years, and meet other screening criteria for risk factors can be approved for a medical certificate directly by the AME without a special issuance.

Diagnoses eligible under this new policy include the following. An individual can have a history of up to two of the following diagnoses, quoting from the policy:

The excitement of the Roaring '20's returns to the sky over southern Ohio as EAA's Ford Tri-Motor tour returns to Chillicothe, Ohio for the 2024 season! Many of you in the Chillicothe area remember when the Ford Tri-Motor first visited this area in September 2022, particularly the 238 of you who booked a flight.

This next stop at Chillicothe's Ross County Airport (KRZT) is scheduled for Thursday, August 22, 2024, through Sunday, August 25. Flights will take place from 2:00 to 5:00 pm on Thursday and from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Friday, Saturday and Sunday, weather permitting.

The Ford Tri-Motor is an American three-engine transport aircraft. Production started in 1925 by the companies of Henry Ford and ended on June 7, 1933, after 199 had been made. It was designed by the civil aviation market but also saw service with military units.

EAA's Ford Tri-Motor was built by Ford Motor Company and first flew in August 1929. The airliner was flown in Cuba and the Dominican Republic for most of the 1930s and '40s until it returned to the United States in 1949 where it would serve a variety of purposes including barnstorming and firefighting. EAA's Ford Tri-Motor also appeared in two feature films, Jerry Lewis' 1965 comedy The Family Jewels and the 2009 crime drama, Public Enemies, starring Johnny Depp.

Tickets aboard the Ford Tri-Motor are \$99 for adults and \$75 for children 17 and under. Every seat in the aircraft is a window seat, offering a view of the surrounding area. Each flight experience is approximately 30 minutes of which about 15 minutes will be in the air.

Tickets may be purchased at the airport on the days and times mentioned. Please check-in with our crew onsite as early as possible on the day you wish to fly.







The airport has a 6,000 ft X 100 ft runway (04/22) non-control tower operation and is on the Jacksonville Sectional chart.

He has over 3,000 hours as a Flight Instructor in both single and multi-engine aircraft and currently serves as both a Warbird Flight Instructor and a Warbird Mechanic.
