EAA CREATING HANDS-ON 'BUILD-AND-FLY' R/C MODEL BUILDING, FLYING OPPORTUNITIES FOR KIDS

Program created in partnership with Academy of Model Aeronautics and AMA Clubs



EAA AVIATION CENTER, OSHKOSH, Wisconsin — (September 27, 2019) — Bringing hands-on aviation activities to young people is the goal as the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) and Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) unveil the new “[Young Eagles Build and Fly](#)” program to engage youth in hands-on building and flying of radio-control aircraft.

The initiative provides EAA chapters the opportunity to purchase a specially designed SIG LT-40 eKadet kit, all building materials, electronics, and accessories that are needed to complete and fly the radio-controlled model. Thanks to the generous support of the Burgher Fund and discounts provided by SIG Manufacturing and Horizon Hobby, the complete project is available to EAA Chapters for just \$500, approximately one-third the usual retail price.

“The Build and Fly program meets the challenges of providing hands-on engagement for youth who have an interest in flight,” said Rick Larsen, EAA’s vice president of publications, programs, and marketing. “Fundamental building skills, aircraft design, theory of flight, and flight training are all involved in a fun project that supplies a true sense of accomplishment when completed. It is also another ‘next step’ possibility for Young Eagles who are flown by EAA chapters throughout the country.”

EAA chapters will partner with their local AMA Club to create a “build project” and a learn-to-fly program for interested youth. Participants will discover how to both build and fly this popular radio-controlled trainer in hopes they will continue their pursuit of aviation. The easy-to-fly LT-40 eKadet is an American-designed and manufactured kit that, when completed, has a nearly six-foot wingspan that can be flown at AMA club flying fields to continue the engagement with youth.

“The path from RC modeling to full-scale aviation is a long-established and successful one,” said Chad Budreau, AMA executive director. “AMA clubs nationwide have the facilities and enthusiasm to welcome and engage a new generation of fliers. We eagerly join with EAA and our partners to make this program a widespread success.”

The “Young Eagles Build and Fly” program is now available to EAA chapters. Additional details are also available at EAA.org/BuildandFly or through EAA and AMA headquarters.

RECORD SETTING FATHER-SON AIR RACING DUO TO SPEAK AT EAA WRIGHT BROTHERS BANQUET DECEMBER



13 Hintons have won a total of nine national unlimited championships EAA AVIATION CENTER, OSHKOSH, Wisconsin — (September 19, 2019) — Steve Hinton and Steven Hinton, the father-and-son duo who have each won national air racing championships and set speed records, will be the keynote speakers at EAA's annual Wright Brothers Memorial Banquet on Friday, December 13, at the EAA Aviation Museum.

Tickets for the banquet are now on sale at EAA.org/WrightBrothers, and are \$60 for EAA members and \$80 for nonmembers. Doors to the event open at 5 p.m., with dinner served at 6:30 p.m. Assigned seats will be selected at time of purchase. Last year, tickets for the Wright Brothers Memorial Banquet sold out.

Steve Hinton, EAA 181203, is the president of Planes of Fame Air Museum in Chino, California, and a retired air racer who won two Unlimited-class national championships at the National Championship Air Races in Reno, Nevada, over the course of his career. In 1979, Steve set the piston-driven aircraft 3-kilometer world speed record in P-51D *Red Baron* (re-designated RB-51 due to extensive modifications), a record he held until 1989. Steve is also renowned for his work in a variety of movies and television series, where he either served as a pilot or aerial coordinator. Among his many credits are *Black Sheep Squadron*, *Die Hard 2*, *The Rocketeer*, *Con Air*, *Air Force One*, *Pearl Harbor*, *Iron Man*, *Dunkirk*, and *First Man*.

As one of the most experienced warbird pilots in the world, Steve is regularly called on to perform test flights for newly restored warbirds. Steve rarely gives public presentations about his career and, as an oft-requested speaker by EAA members, this is an incredible opportunity for aviation enthusiasts to see him speak in his first appearance on stage at EAA.

Meanwhile, Steven Hinton has won seven Unlimited-class national championships at the Reno Air Races, doing so in the highly-modified P-51Ds *Strega* and *Voodoo*. In 2017, Steven set the world speed record for a propeller-driven, piston-powered aircraft, doing so in *Voodoo* with a speed of 531.53 mph — breaking the record of 528

mph set by Lyle Shelton in 1989 in the F8F Bearcat *Rare Bear*, which had previously broken Steve Hinton's record.

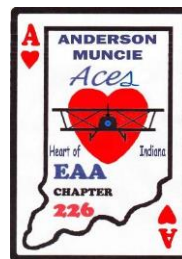

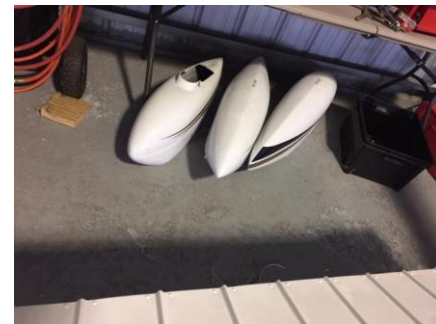

What is Preventive Maintenance?

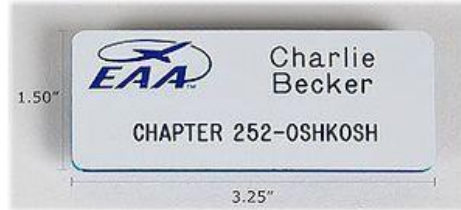
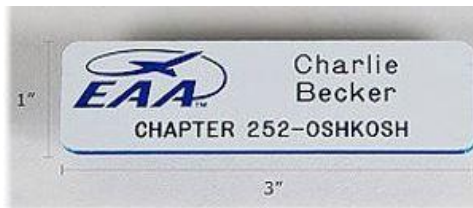

The FAA permits a pilot to perform preventive maintenance (PM) on an aircraft owned or operated by that pilot, provided the aircraft is used strictly for non-commercial operations. Pilots may do PM without any A&P involvement, which is pretty cool. But what exactly constitutes PM? In FAR Part 43 Appendix A, the FAA has listed 31 specific tasks that they consider to be PM. But in 2009, the FAA's Rulemaking Division issued a little-known legal interpretation that expands the definition of PM far beyond those 31 items. In this webinar, maintenance expert Mike Busch takes you through these regs. and legal interpretations to shed light on the question of what maintenance tasks it is really permissible for a pilot to do on his own recognizance. Qualifies for FAA WINGS and AMT credit.

Lafayette Escadrille events

The Lafayette Escadrille was a World War I French Air Service fighter unit, serving from 1916 to early 1918, with American volunteer pilots commanded by French officers. Their exploits drew enormous press coverage, helping to increase U.S. enthusiasm for the Allied cause and eventual American entry into the war.

World Premiere of the documentary “The Lafayette Escadrille”

In the Air Force Museum Theatre

The Lafayette Escadrille is the first comprehensive documentary film made about the American volunteers who flew for France before the United States entered World War I. They have been called “the Founding Fathers of American combat aviation.” Filmed at over 40 locations in France, drawing on over 20 interviews, and thousands of original artifacts, letters, memoirs, photographs, and films, The Lafayette Escadrille follows the path of the young Americans who came to the aid of America’s oldest ally—standing up for the shared values of freedom and liberty shared by the sister republics. It is the only American story that covers the entire duration of the war, from one end of the Western Front to the other.

They were all types—some Ivy League educated; some raised on the streets. The youngest was 20, the oldest, 40. There were three architects, four lawyers, a physician, and one former human cannonball. One was blind in one eye and deaf in one ear. Two of them were not even human—they were lions. The story is the characters, all of them defending France. Their leadership showed the United States the way before America entered the war. Tickets \$12.00; Members & Military - \$10.00.

Canine Warriors

Courage and Sacrifice, Always Beside You

A temporary exhibit featuring Wounded Warrior Dogs wooden sculptures by artist James Mellick will be on display in the Kettering Hall from Nov. 8, 2019 through Jan. 31, 2020.

Mellick started the Wounded War Dogs Project, a traveling exhibition of wooden dog sculptures, to be symbolic of the sacrifices made and the wounds suffered by their human companions in battle and bring attention to the service and heroism of military working dogs.

About the artist:

James Mellick

A native of Ohio, Jim Mellick has been creating art and teaching art since the 1970s. He received his Master of Fine Arts from Southern Illinois University in 1973. His preferred medium is wood, from which he sculpts movement, life, and emotion. Retiring from full-time teaching in 2014, he began the creation of the “Wounded Warrior Dogs Project” and started touring the exhibition in 2015.



Over the Rainbow Bridge

Story of Lucca and Cooper:

Lucca K458 is laminated and carved basswood that has been bleached, stained, and burned for coloring. Tongue is carved cherry and teeth are maple. The medallion replica of the Dickin Medal is 3D-printed.

Cooper K154 is laminated and carved basswood. Dove and football are carved and painted basswood.

Trained to detect explosives for the Marine Corps, Lucca completed more than 400 missions over a 6-year career. In 2012 on patrol in Afghanistan, she barely survived an IED blast. In 2016, she received the

prestigious Dickin Medal for “conspicuous gallantry” by the People’s Dispensary for Sick Animals, a British organization.

Lucca and Cooper were on assignment together in 2007 in Iraq. Between patrols, Lucca and Cooper snoozed together in shady patches or cavorted with a deflated football. Cooper and his handler, Army Cpl Kory Wiens, were on patrol on 6 July 2007 when an insurgent remotely detonated an IED hidden in a haystack, killing both instantly.

The dove on Cooper’s back signifies the angel wings he earned. The football is Cooper’s connection on Earth to Lucca. It celebrates the dogs’ playfulness and camaraderie, which brought joy to warfighters.



U.S. Air Force and Military Working Dogs:

The 341st Training Squadron at the Military Working Dog Center on JBSA-Lackland provides training to military working dogs (MWDs) used in patrol, drug and explosive detection, and specialized mission functions for the Department of Defense (DoD) and other government agencies. Personnel conduct operational training of MWD handlers and supervisors and sustain DoD MWD program through logistical support, veterinary care, and research and development for security efforts worldwide.

The DOD Military Working Dog program, the world’s largest training center for military dogs and handlers, has been based at JBSA-Lackland since 1958. The DOD Military Working Dog Veterinary Service and the Holland Working Dog Hospital, the largest for military working dogs, are also located on JBSA-Lackland.

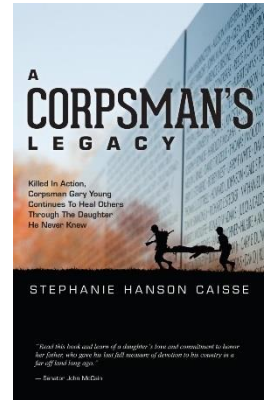
