Ellie advises the bridge repair on Highway 8 has been completed so your GPS should work. Ellie has also provided the following directions for members:

Coming from the **Abingdon** area, take Martin street east from route 41 which becomes Highway 20. Continue a couple miles over the new bridge, continue straight past the RT 8 intersection, then at the next Y in the road, keep right past the grain bins and continue STAIGHT onto the gravel road. The driveway is a 1/2 mile long gravel and the farm shop will be on your left when you enter that driveway. If you go up a big hill and pass a greenhouse, you've gone too far.

Coming from the **Knoxville** area, GPS should get you there. Follow Highway 8 south of Knoxville until you hit the T, Left at the T (Highway 20), then at the next Y in the road, keep right past the grain bins and continue STAIGHT onto the gravel road. The driveway is a 1/2 mile long gravel and the farm shop will be on your left when you enter that driveway. If you go up a big hill and pass a greenhouse, you've gone too far.

Coming from the **Maquon** area, GPS should get you there. Follow Highway 20 west towards Abingdon. When you get to the Y next to the grain bins, Highway 20 continues right, but you will KEEP LEFT around the farm shop onto Knox Rd 900 E, continue STAIGHT onto the gravel road. The driveway is a 1/2 mile long

gravel and the farm shop will be on your left when you enter that driveway. If you go up a big hill and pass a greenhouse, you've gone too far.
