Featured Member Biographies

FAA Action on Galesburg DME/ILS/LOC

As most of you know, the FAA recently published notice of its intention to decommission the KGBG DME with the apparently intended consequence of eliminating the KGBG RWY 3 ILS/LOC approach. The FAA is accepting comments on this proposed action until December 21, 2021. Reprinted below is Aaron Repp's discussion about the proposed action which would appear to adversely affect all Chapter members as aircraft owners or users of Galesburg Airport. All interested persons, pilots and owners are encouraged to express their opposition to this proposed action. Aaron's message follows:

The Galesburg VOR was officially decommissioned in August of 2021 and the FAA is now looking to decommission the DME housed in the old VOR structure. With the most recent version of the ILS/LOC Runway 03 approach at the Galesburg airport, the DME is now a required component to execute either approach. With the DME decommissioned, the ILS/LOC Runway 03 approach at KGBG will be eliminated.

The ILS/LOC Runway 03 approach is the only ground based navigation approach at Galesburg, meaning, that after the decommissioning, **you MUST have an IFR certified GPS plus WAAS capabilities** to have the same landing minimums provided by the current ILS in order to land at Galesburg should IFR/IMC conditions be present. Furthermore, the ILS/LOC approach at Galesburg is the <u>ONLY</u> precision approach, a back-up should there ever be any issue with the Global Positioning System and acts as a foundation to basic IFR flight training and pilot currency.

Please take the time, through email/and or letter, no later than December 21st, to voice the importance of the ILS/LOC approach at Galesburg and the negative effects the decommissioning of the DME may have. A sample letter has been attached to this email along with the Proposed Non-Rulemaking study from the FAA and a copy of the current ILS/LOC Runway 03 approach.

The following is from Phillip Wolford, President of Jet Air, Inc. and Chapter 1643 member:

We Need Your Help!! As a user of the Galesburg Airport, we would like you to send an Email and/or Letter with your request for the FAA to not decommission the DME and to stress the importance of saving the only ILS / LOC approach into Galesburg!
