# The Four Who Flew--The Kalishek Family in the Early Days Aviation

- Presented by Kylie Kalishek on Tuesday, May 14<sup>th</sup>

Menominee Michigan EAA Chapter 1672 is sponsoring a talk by Kylie Kalishek of Gladstone, Delta County. The presentation is about the four Kalishek siblings who were at the forefront of aviation during its infancy. All of the siblings



were born in Menominee County before moving to Gladstone around 1910 as children.

These pioneers, whose stories have been lost to history, were extraordinary pilots, fearless performers, and three of them, tenacious business women. All of them helped to pave the way for what we know as aviation today. Before Amelia Earhart, alongside some of the bravest aerial acrobats to surf the skies, the Kalisheks were there.

Presenter Kylie Kalishek is the granddaughter of one of these aviators, Clifford Kalishek. Her goal is to preserve their history while inspiring a future generation to fly as fearlessly as these pilots from the past. The talk will include hundreds of photos and some videos of their daredevil performances.

#### Scholarship Deadline Approaching

The **EAA Chapter 1672 Babe Kalishek Memorial Aviation Scholarship** application deadline is May 15<sup>th</sup>. Residents of Menominee Co, MI, and Marinette and Oconto Cos., WI ages 16-19 are eligible for the scholarship to a maximum amount of \$3,000. Funds can be spent at any flight school towards a Private Pilot certificate, although not through a university or flight club program. The applicant must take a discovery or YE flight; belong to our EAA chapter; pass an FAA medical exam; and intend to pursue a career in aviation. A GPA of at least 3.0 in school is required.

A committee of several chapter members will oversee the award of the scholarships. Four scholarships are available for this year with an application deadline of May 15<sup>th</sup>. A decision will be made by May 31<sup>st</sup>. Funds will be paid directly to the recipient's flight school.

The application will consist of a one-page resume and an essay on another page. For further information contact: <u>jeremy.anderson11@yahoo.com</u>
