Featured Chapter Member: Jim Bedsole

Jim Bedsole tells everyone that he is "living the dream." He and his wife Lynne own a home on the Sebastian Cove Airstrip (32GA) at Lake Oconee, have a hangar in their backyard, and have a Van's RV-6A and a pontoon boat in that hangar. With a grass runway literally in the backyard and one of the nicest lakes in Georgia with a private neighborhood boat ramp just a ½ mile down the road, finding something to do in their spare time is never a problem for Jim and Lynne.

Jim grew up on Air Force bases around the world as his father served 21 years on active duty in the Transportation field in the USAF. As long as he can remember, Jim wanted to fly. Like many boys growing up in the 1960s he had early aspirations to be a fighter pilot and astronaut, but poor eyesight made that dream an impossibility. With no clear direction and guidance, it wound up being many years before he finally found the right circumstances of time, money, and location to learn to fly and got his private pilot certificate in 2007 at the age of 48 in Mount Pleasant, SC. This was followed with an instrument rating 18 months later.

Because of his early childhood travels, Jim started school in England and as a result wound up a year ahead of his age group throughout school. He graduated from high school in Portsmouth, NH two days before his 17 th birthday. Ten days after he turned 17, he was at US Army basic training at Fort Dix, NJ. That will make you grow up fast. He served 2 years on active duty in the Field Artillery corps. This was followed by another five years in the SC Army National Guard while attending The Citadel as a Veteran Student.

After graduating from The Citadel, Jim has spent the last 38 years in the banking profession serving in a variety of risk management related roles including internal audit, regulatory compliance, security, and risk management. He has numerous professional certifications and is a nationally recognized thought leader in the banking compliance profession. Most recently, he has been the Chief Compliance & Risk Officer for BankSouth at Lake Oconee for the past 10 years. This will soon end, as he is scheduled to retire from banking on August 1, 2024, and looking forward to having a lot more time to focus on other pursuits.

Jim bought his first (and only) airplane, his RV-6a in December 2018. The airplane was in Livermore, California so Jim and Vern Darley, a well-known RV expert, CFI-I, and DAR took a Delta flight to SFO and flew the RV back to Georgia. That was an incredible learning experience for Jim, both regarding the RV airplane itself and the process of planning and executing a true across-the-whole-country cross-country flight. He now has almost 300 hours of flight time in this airplane with a total of over 720 hours. It would have been a lot more, but for 22 months of down time due to a runway overrun incident that damaged the plane.

In 2019, Jim attended his first EAA Airventure and has been back every year since (except 2020 when they didn't have it because of COVID). He is looking forward to Airventure 2024. In addition to aviation, as a devoted follower of Jesus Christ, Jim is very active in his church, Grace Fellowship of Greensboro, GA, having served as a Small Group Leader, Elder, and Church Moderator.

Because of the lack of guidance he received when he was young about options for learning to fly, Jim has a strong desire to encourage young people in learning to fly. He is excited to be an active part of this new EAA chapter that shares that passion.
