October Featured Chapter Member: Anne Chamlee




My husband, Tilmon Chamlee, was a pilot and flew the V-tail Bonanza N101JM for a long time with many flights, mostly for business. I loved flying with him and enjoyed many rewarding trips. His daily/weekly experiences with the local airport after we moved to Lake Sinclair in February 1983 were often shared with me, his secretary and go-fer . Acting in that capacity, I was part of the various things involving the


airplane and 'all things aviation'. Tilmon served in the U.S. Navv during the Korean conflict aboard the USS Essex, an aircraft carrier.



Twice we went to Oshkosh AirVenture and loved every minute of it! My favorite performances were the Warbirds flyovers. We tried to attend any airshow within a reasonable distance from Macon.

After our move to Lake Sinclair in 1983, almost every Saturday morning Tilmon would go to the terminal at "Our" airport and hang out with the other pilots/aviation enthusiasts. One morning, he telephoned me saying "get up here" - so I did. He had arranged a flight for me in an open cockpit plane, the 'Starduster Two' – on a stopover cross-country flight. That was a TREAT!







My husband Tilmon was an architect and had several projects in Dublin, Georgia, where he oversaw the design and construction of the Bud Barron Airport terminal. I learned a lot about airport needs during those times.

Our home is on Lake Sinclair adjacent to the flight path on the east end of the runway – so I see and hear airplanes every day. It is interesting to watch and hear them and I am delighted to see the

expansion and growth of our wonderful Baldwin County Regional Airport. The EAA Chapter is doing a fine job of highlighting the airport and aviation in so many ways - making it welcoming to so many visitors. We are privileged to be part of an organization dedicated to making our community airport such a wonderful place. He is also a proud EAA member!
