Our board member-at-large and Baldwin High School Aerospace Class teacher Roberto Hornung is thrilled to welcome 75 boys and 11 girls in all 3 levels of this year's Aerospace Class! His class is ready! His aviation Lab currently has 3 flight simulators, 2 brand new Drones and he can count on 2 of his former students who have returned to assist him teaching other students. His aerospace class just started a hands-on drone maintenance practical course, where they repair the drones that perform an average of 75 to 100 flights daily. His students are also running an Air Traffic Control (ATC) simulation class, where they experience what an ATC environment entails. At one of our Chapter Social Gatherings in 2024, we enjoyed a very interesting presentation by Roberto and one of his students, Dale Rice, who is now a fully licensed commercial drone pilot. Roberto told us that one of his New Year's resolutions was to license another 4 Commercial Drone Pilots and 25 Recreational Drone Pilots by the end of May. We are counting on that! It is so rewarding for all of us at Chapter 1685 to witness such a transformation in our youth community. Well done, Roberto!

That's right! The much-awaited EAA introductory flight experience dedicated to our adults will be offered for the first time by our Chapter on May 17th! Watching my husband Jim's excitement as he took his first flying lessons was great fun. First flight, first solo, tearing of the shirt, and first certification were all steps I enjoyed as an observer.

We first got involved with the Baldwin County Regional Airport in 1985. That is when Jim and 2 others created Air Sinclair, Inc to operate the airfield's first fixed base operation (FBO). The early days were fun as the men developed the business. I became the office manager, housekeeper and chef. I kept the files, invoices, bills – and cleaned and swept and dusted. I was the FBO's girl Friday and housewife. I learned to respond on the Unicom. The most fun was bringing in homemade chocolate chip cookies. There were the usual FBO daily residents. They would come and chat or read the newspaper or books and just hang out. Of course, they enjoyed coffee from their mug hung on the wall for safe keeping. I enjoyed those casual relaxed friendships.

Over the years I've watched the development and improvements to Baldwin County Regional Airport. The new terminal and landscaping, extensions to the runway, development of beautiful and visually pleasing matching hangars, fencing around the airport for the safety of both aviators and the neighborhood – keeping out curious children, pets and wildlife. At the same time, I watched activities increase at BCRA with fly-ins, and events like bringing in EAA's B17 and providing (with local donations and support) rides for residents of the Georgia War Veterans Home. We hosted bi-wings, Chinooks, Blackhawks and Navions. It is very rewarding when students from local grade schools and colleges come, tour and learn about opportunities. Families come and have a picnic and watch planes land and depart. Grandpa and Grandmother wait "patiently" for their children to fly in with that special cargo – grandkids.
