"First Time" in a Lifetime

At some point in life, as the years transpire, you realize it's difficult to ever reclaim that elusive "First Time" in much of anything. It's easy to grow comfortable in your "achievements" in life, and reminisce on what it used to be like to chase success and taste fear, fit only for one's lost youth and invincibility. But alas, on December 5, 2023, I shed the shackles of self-doubt, and lived the experience of one of the greatest "Firsts" I've ever known. On that cool December's winter day, I soloed my first aircraft, my own aircraft, at that, and flew around the pattern like a bird that finally left the nest and got her wings. I was full of the best kind of everything: fear, exhilaration, trepidation and hope. Was I READY? Is anyone ever READY to pilot an aircraft on their own? Is anyone ever READY to take their own life or death into their lone inexperienced hands?

Truth be told, I WAS ready. Not in the cup of experience, but rather in the cup of confidence and desire for the taste of that elusive "First Time" that very few of us get to grasp in our later years in life. Sometimes, it's the lure of fear, and that which make others roll their eyes at your dreams, that motivates you to achieve your greatest joys. If there is one lesson I could share with anyone wondering if it's too late to chase a dream, it is to say, "It's never too late to remind yourself what it feels like to truly be alive." It's never too late to push yourself, challenge yourself, test yourself and dare yourself to accomplish what most would consider an exercise in futility or a chance at failure. It's never too late to spread your wings and fly, risk defeat, and embrace that personal fear, known only to you.

Experiencing that elusive "First" of Solo Flight in our Cessna 172, out of KMLJ, can truly only be likened to, for me, the first time I ever left an airplane as a skydiver, 15 years and almost 1000 jumps ago. Embracing one's own fear, head-on and head-first. inevitably leads us to the fullest of hearts, the greatest of strength, and the purest of experience this life has to offer. Aviation, whether it be leaping from a plane, piloting your own, or supporting a loved one who chases that dream, offers a world few will ever know they are missing. If you're thinking of chasing that dream, don't miss it! I have a long way to go before I reach that mountain top, but the journey is as sweet as the reward, and I'm excited to share my experiences and my heart with anyone who dares to chase their own "First Time."

Never let go of what makes you feel alive!



Aviation History



In December, 1957 the Boeing 707, the first successful commercial jet airliner was introduced and followed about ten years later by the iconic Boeing 747. Meanwhile humans had gone into space and in 1969 Apollo 11 landed on the moon and returned the astronauts to earth safely.





In 2024 the number, variation, and complexity of aircraft is bewildering. Think for a moment what it takes to get all the aircraft in and out of Hartsfield International Airport in Atlanta. In 2022 93.6 million passengers passed through that airport alone. The logistics of such an accomplishment is staggering but it happens, year after year.

In 2023 SpaceX, a private company owned by Elon Musk, made 76 successful launches of orbital spacecraft delivering payloads for a wide array of customers. In other words, his company has made space travel far more affordable and common. One of his goals is to make humans an interplanetary species. Who could have dreamed where aviation would take us and what will aviation be like in another 30 years?
