Your EAA Chapter is thrilled to share the great news about our second EAA Young Eagles Rally! We had a record-breaking 33 participants - each of these 33 youngsters had a fantastic flying experience on perhaps one of this Fall's most beautiful days! Thanks to our great team of volunteers and 3 very generous Young Eagles Pilots, these kids were able to fly for 20 minutes over Lake Sinclair and downtown Milledgeville. They were inspired to consider the various possibilities available to them with EAA's Young Eagles Flight Plan. Parents and their teenage kids were greeted by a group of excited volunteers who, after check-in, moved them to our airport's FBO conference room for an overview presentation. Here they learned about what their flight would be like, including a discussion of the principles of flight, a flight itinerary, and an important message on safety in and around airplanes. Additionally, the Baldwin High School Soccer Booster Club members set up a refreshment tent. It was an incredible day!
