December 7, 1941, the day of the attack on Pearl Harbor, catapulted us into WWII. For a young man, James C. Ray, it was the catalyst for him enlisting in the Army Air Corp. In addition to a distinguished career as a pilot, he was very involved in general aviation and a long-time benefactor of the EAA. In 1963, James, and his wife, Joan, founded the Ray Foundation to support programs and organizations, primarily within the field of aviation, that develop life skills such as honesty, work ethic, self-confidence and self-discipline in young adults. In 2019, this foundation created the EAA Ray Aviation Scholarship Program, managed by EAA and administered by select local EAA Chapters. This year, we are very pleased to announce that our chapter was selected to participate in this legacy in 2025.

Moline, IL / Quad Cities International Airport (KMLI)

This scholarship committee has been working diligently to create a fair, competitive process to select the right candidate for this honor. The scholarship will be open to 16-19 year olds that have the ability to complete flight training, including their check ride, before the end of 2025. We utilized this format at our last Young Eagles Rally on March 8 with great success and positive feedback!!!! To be able to do this, it takes a village, and our current village is incredible!!!! A huge thank you to the ground crew that made it such a success!!!!! If you are interested in helping make this year even better, please let me know!














SHOW YOUR CHAPTER SPIRIT!!

Yes. First, analog (121.5 MHz) ELTs can only be tested within the first five minutes after the hour. This is done by triggering the device briefly while listening for the audible signal on 121.5 MHz. No more than three audible sweeps can be transmitted. Airborne testing of ELTs is prohibited. Digital (406 MHz) ELTs should only be tested in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

With regards to the batteries, ELTs must be inspected every 12 calendar months, and this is typically done as part of the annual inspection. Batteries must be replaced after one hour of cumulative use or when 50 percent of their usable life has expired. The date for replacing or recharging the battery must be legibly marked on the outside of the transmitter and entered in the aircraft maintenance record.

Additional information regarding the use, inspection, and testing of ELTs can be found in AC 91-44A, Operational and Maintenance Practices for Emergency Locator Transmitters and Receivers.
