Additionally, if you are not yet an EAA national member, you will receive a free, six month membership with all privileges of a full member.

As we move forward this year, we have plans to expand our outreach, fundraising efforts, grant applications, hospitality, social media presence, and develop more comprehensive approaches to Young Eagles and Eagles events. So much on the horizon to look forward to and so many opportunities for you to utilize your talents to get the most out of your membership!

Chapter Scholarship Update

We want to provide a short update on where our chapter is at with regards to the Ray Aviation Scholarship.

- Our Chapter has applied to EAA for a full Ray Scholarship, \$12,000 for 2025
- EAA will notify winning chapters beginning late Feb to early March
- Our Chapter has begun forming our Scholarship Committee in anticipation of receiving a scholarship
- Interested Chapter Youth must meet minimum requirements listed below

Eligibility Requirements for the Ray Aviation Scholarship

- 1 Must be Age 16 – 19 for powered flight training
- 2 Must possess an FAA Medical Certificate
- 3 Must possess an FAA Student Pilot Certificate
- 4 Must begin flight training within 60 days of accepting the award
- 5 Must be able to volunteer for Chapter service a min of 2 hours per month
- 6 Must meet with the Coordinator and submit a Monthly Activity Report which details flight training and volunteer activities and costs.
- 7 Must be able to schedule at least 3 flight lessons per week
- 8 Must be able to Solo within 3 months of start
- 9 Must be able to pass the FAA Knowledge Test within 6 months
- 10 Must be able to take and pass the FAA Checkride within 12 months

Boost Your Application Score

Here is a short list of things you can do now to help boost your application score. While none of these guarantee a scholarship, they will help set your application above other applicants.

Take a Young Eagle Flight: Becoming a “Young Eagle” opens up tremendous opportunities to help you advance in your flight training. The best part is that Young Eagle flights are given FREE from EAA Chapter Volunteers. Flights do not need to be completed with EAA 1702...any EAA Chapter Young Eagle flight applies! You can search for upcoming Young Eagle Rallies by visiting <https://events.eaachapters.org> or contact one of the chapters listed at the bottom of the page for more info.

Complete EAA’s “Young Eagle Flight Plan”: By taking a Young Eagle Flight, you receive FREE access to Sporty’s Private Pilot Ground School. Progressing or completing this online course not only helps you learn the knowledge required to become a pilot, but shows the scholarship committee your discipline and dedication to learning to fly. You should’ve received an email with link to access course at the email submitted when you took your Young Eagle Flight.

Completion of AeroEducate Elemental / Grade Badges: EAA’s AeroEducate is a FREE, self-paced online activity program for you to explore the exciting world of aviation. Through online activities, you will learn about the principles of flight, aviation technologies, and the vast career opportunities in aviation and Aerospace. MARCH - FAA MEDICAL DISCUSSION WITH DR. JAMES BLUM, SENIOR AME

We welcome Dr. James Blum, senior Aero-Medical Examiner from Iowa City to lead a discussion on FAA Medical Requirements for Pilots. This is a great session to attend if you are a looking to start flight training or a certified pilot with questions about Medical Renewal process and Basic Med.


EAA Chapter 1702 Monthly Gathering Guest Speaker

VMC Question of the Month ANSWER

No, it is not permissible. According to AC 91.21-1D, paragraph 9.1, Restricting Airborne Cellular Telephone Use, "The FCC prohibits cellular telephone operation while airborne, as noted in Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations (47 CFR) part 22, § 22.925. This restriction is valid for all aircraft without technical provisions that enable control of onboard mobile devices to eliminate interference between ground-based cellular stations and airborne cellular devices. If technical provisions are installed, compliant with, or exempt from 47 CFR § 22.925, then usage of cellular-enabled PEDs is acceptable."
