

#### <u>Treasurer's Message</u>

My friends and fellow aviators,

Let's take a moment to review our chapter financial history and our forecast for the coming year.



Our revenues are typically a 50/50 split between membership fees and meal donations. The pandemic years of 2020 and 2021 are an obvious exception. Expenses are normally \$1,500 for mandatory expenses (chapter insurance, tax, utilities) plus \$500 to \$1,000 for food and hangar supplies, depending on our activities. We started 2021 with \$4,172 and ended with a cash balance of \$3,178, not bad considering we waived membership fees in 2021.

Our plan for 2022 is to return to member activities and shared meals. We also plan to repair and improve our hangar facility as volunteers and funds permit.



## **Identify this Airplane**

Last month's image was of an Edgley EA-7 Optica – a low-speed aircraft designed for observation missions. Intentionally created to fly at slow speeds – 108-130 km/h (67-81mph) – the three-seater craft leverages the 270-degree panoramic visibility of a helicopter but at a much lower cost than its counterpart. The Optica is considered one of the quietest touring aircraft available.

#### WHERE TO FIND US:
