Our 2021 Triple Tree adventure

I have been to Triple Tree twice before this year. The first time was when Ronna and I drove up for the day, on Saturday, I think it was in 2017, and the President of EAA, Jack Pelton was presenting there. We ran into some friends from Sun N Fun and had a fun time. The other time was when Joe Britt invited me to fly up with him in his RV9A and I jumped at the chance. Joe even let me "manipulate the controls" for a little while to get a feel for how the 9A flys. That was great fun and a fond memory.

Then for a couple of years since Ronna and I have had our camper we have been trying to make it up there, but the move to the new house, and then Covid postponed our plans. So this year we committed ourselves to Triple Tree come hell or high water. We would have liked to have gone for the full week but we had other "stuff" to do so we didn't get up there until Thursday. It was just as well because it had rained heavily the first part of the week and was still pretty soggy by the time we arrived. Since this was our first time camping there, we spent a bit of time driving around to find a spot to setup camp. Before getting to our final spot we got the rig stuck in soggy ground. Luckily there were a bunch of friendly "plane" people who came to our rescue and got us un-stuck. We decided to dry-camp since we were only there for 3 days. (To those of you who are not campers, that means camping without TV, microwave oven and AC.) There were already quite a few people camping and a fair amount of aircraft.

Friday morning it really started to get busy. The number of aircraft operations nearly rivaled Sun N Fun at times. What really impressed me was the variety of aircraft present at this event. There was every type of aircraft from Ultralights to Cessna Caravans. Most of the factory built aircraft types were represented, from vintage to more modern Cessnas, Pipers and Beechcraft. There were also a fair amount of Homebuilts as well. The WWII era and other military aircraft, included a P51 mustang, a P40 as well as a Cessna L19/Bird-dog. There were also a couple of military trainers that were apparently giving rides. The rotor craft were also represented with a privately

owned UH-1 Huey on display, a Bell 47 that was giving rides like they do at Oshkosh, along with several other types. If you like the open cockpit, bugs in your teeth type of flying, there was a Stearman giving rides all day long.

We were pleasantly surprised to find that this event was attended by many of the folks we have met through our Chapter including past president Sid Brown and his son Ben, Aron Ramsey, and Ken Rayburn.

Joe Britt landed on Friday at around 10AM. We caught up with him a bit later in the day and were introduced to a couple of his friends that he met up with there. We found everyone at this event to be super friendly and helpful. We could not even walk anywhere without being offered rides. Carl & amp; Sandy Walther flew in on Saturday morning and I even got a shot of them landing. Ronna and I were so happy to be able to just hang out there with friends and to be able to relax and participate as just spectators instead of working as volunteers. We love our "work" at Oshkosh and Sun N Fun but is was a nice change of pace to just enjoy a fly-in with friends.
