The late Patty Koetz worked to get Chapter 175 the annual job of making sandwiches and providing coolers filled with Lemonade or Water, for Sun 'n Fun in 1992. The Chapter has carried the tradition on now for the eighth year.

What started out to be around 10,000 sandwiches for the week has

now developed into a monstrous 20,000 sandwiches this vear.

That is Chapter 175's mission and Pete and crew will assure it happens with just a little consideration, study, and help from the folks at Sun 'n Fun.


Forums Grows Each Year, Two Co-Chairmen Retire

members of EAA by making available the leading experts, in just about every field of aviation, to Sun 'n Fun participants .





The following is a short overview of activities and events happening in the next couple of months at Vandenberg Airport. EAA Chapter is a key component of Vandenberg Airport and the Hillsborough County Aviation Authority (HCAA) wants to keep you, the airport user, as informed as possible.

EVENTS:

TECO Energy Brandon Balloon Classic: April 28, 29, & 30th, 2000

HCAA is very excited about the upcoming activities at Vandenberg within the next couple of months. On February 27th, Melissa Roe of Event Makers, and I met with you at the chapter's monthly meeting and were impressed with your enthusiasm to be involved with the TECO Energy Brandon balloon Classic.

We are expecting 20,000 people over the three day event and could use all of the EAA Chapter's support possible. Static Aircraft, Young Eagle Flights, volunteers to control the three airport entrances. We'll need six volunteers, two per gate to assure that only Vandenberg tenants, and balloon people are allowed to use those gates. We also would like for you to assist leading Edge Aviation in aircraft ground control. We are asking that volunteers be at the gates at 6:00 PM Friday night and by 7:00 AM Saturday morning.

CONSTRUCTION:

New Terminal Building:

As some of you have already seen, we have occupied the new terminal Building. My office is located on the second floor next to the elevator. I have an open door policy, so please, come and visit when you are in the area.

MALSR Lights:

Once again, we will be closing the 800 foot displaced threshold to complete the installation of the MALSR lights. This should be happening shortly, so keep in touch with the Flight Service for published NOTAMS of runway closures.

LOCALIZER:

The FAA has received our application for approval to install a localizer for runway 23. As soon as the paperwork is returned, we can begin the process to purchase and install. Hopefully, we will see the installation of there localizer by mid-summer.

Vandenberg Expansion, Phase 6A:

Just when you think we are finished, we start again. Beginning Tuesday, March 21, 2000 you should have seen surveyors working in the vicinity of Runway 5-23. We have commenced the design for taxiway J and adjacent hangars (Bulk and T-Hangars). Soon we will begin more construction in the field South of runway 5-23. Keep your eyes and ears open to airfield reports, they'll be coming fast!

SAFETY:

The Safety Committee met on Saturday, March 18, 2000 in the new Terminal Building Conference Room. One of the discussion topics was the new Tampa International Airport Website, www.TampaAirport.com. Under the General Aviation Airports icon, a new Safety Suggestion Program has been introduced for each of the airports. Easily Assessable, is a safety suggestion icon that leads into an e-mail format to send your suggestions straight to our office. Please feel free to e-mail your safety suggestions. You folks are one of our most helpful assets by reporting problems or concerns to help us maintain a safe airport environment!
