Tuesday, June 4th was beautiful day to fly so my RV-6 and I headed to Capitol Airport to visit.

I checked the wind sock and called base and final for runway 9. I was a little high to land so put the RV into a slip to lose altitude, came out of the slip, saw what I believed was green runway ahead so proceeded to land. All of a sudden I'm in total darkness and upside down with water coming in the broken canopy. In hindsight, I had let the plane drift off while in slip configuration.

My first thoughts were "I hope I don't drown here, then second, NO ONE will know I'm here." I had made a call for final but guys do that all the time and then go somewhere else. Being upside down everything is out of place but I still had my headphones on even though in partial water. I found the mike button, and called the Capitol office. "I'm in the marsh upside down and trapped." They immediately drove down the runway and saw nothing. Ken Reese jumped in his plane, flew the area and saw the RV. He then went back to the office and rushed out with other people to assist. By now flight for life and news choppers were hovering overhead.

The people at the airport, the rescue, the police.....all came to my rescue. I was able to unlock the canopy as they raised the tail of the plane and I was able to crawl out and walk out of the marsh unassisted. I actually felt alright, but the rescue personnel insisted that I should be evaluated at a hospital. I was taken to Froedtert and released finding only a small abrasion on my hand.

Meanwhile Eric Whyte sent out a text/email for help in getting the RV out of the marsh. Many chapter members responded to a call for help in getting the plane out. About 16 responded, both men and women, even a doggie, and trudged thru the marsh water, tall grass and muck. They first uprighted the plane and then the ingenious part, got two flat bottom boats, lifted one wheel into each boat, raised the tail and by hand pushed and pulled to dry land....about 1,000 ft off runway. I received a call about 8:30 p.m that the plane was secure and in a hangar. I COULD NOT BELIEVE IT! Talk about coming together to help a fellow pilot!!

We've met and talked with some of the people from Capitol Airport, Chapter 18, the rescue personnel, fire and ambulance. HOW can I ever THANK everyone of them for my rescue and the difficult job of getting the plane out?

Talk about lucky and being in the "wrong place with the right people."
