**PROPOSED AMENDMENT 1-14 TO THE CONSTITUTION AND
BY-LAWS CHAPTER 18 EXPERIMENTAL AIRCRAFT
ASSOCIATION**

The board has audited the current chapter bylaws and are proposing some changes. The amendments must be published to the membership one month prior to the vote. Assuming we have a quorum at the November meeting, the chapter will vote on the changes at that time.

Please review the proposed changes and be ready to exercise your right to vote at the November Chapter Meeting

ARTICLE I – NAME

Current wording: The name of this organization shall be 'The Greater Milwaukee Chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association'.

Revised Wording: The name of this organization shall be 'Experimental Aircraft Association Greater Milwaukee Chapter 18, Inc.'

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 5 – Spouse Membership change to SECTION 5. – Family Membership

SECTION 5. – Family Membership

Current Wording: The Spouse of members in good standing shall be entitled to participate in Chapter activities without an individual membership, in a non-voting capacity, unless elected or appointed to a voting position on the governing body. Upon being elected or appointed to a voting position, they would, at that time, be required to pay dues on the same basis as any other member.

Revised Wording: The immediate family of members in good standing shall be entitled to participate in Chapter activities without an individual membership, in a non-voting capacity, unless elected or appointed to a voting position on the governing body. Upon being elected or appointed to a voting position, they would, at that time, be required to pay dues on the same basis as any other member.

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

SECTION 6. - The Treasurer

Current working: d. An annual audit of the treasury records shall be conducted by a committee of not less than three Chapter members in good standing who do not hold an elected or appointed office. The audit shall be conducted during the first month of the calendar year and prior to a new Treasurer assuming his duties in an official capacity.

Revised Wording: d. An audit of the treasury records shall be conducted by a committee of not less than three Chapter members in good standing who do not hold an elected or appointed office. The audit shall be conducted when called for by the president, board, or membership.

ARTICLE VII - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Current Wording: a. Board of Directors will consist of seven (7) Directors serving two (2) year terms with four (4) being elected in the same year as the Vice-President and Secretary and three (3) being elected in the alternate year along with the President and Treasurer.

Revised Wording: a. Board of Directors will consist of five (5) Directors serving two (2) year terms with three (3) being elected in the same year as the Vice-President and Secretary and two (2) being elected in the alternate year along with the President and Treasurer.

Current Wording: e. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be called at a time and place as determined by the President, generally the second Monday of each month, excluding December. (If you're reading this and are planning to enter the Camel Challenge, write "I read the proposed bylaws, Stosh" on your entry email and you will receive a second entry...a second chance to win. Read on.)

Revised Wording: e. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be called at a time and place as determined by the President.

Current Wording: j. Expenditures in excess of three-hundred dollars (\$300) after approval by the Board of Directors, must be approved by the members at a regularly scheduled meeting.

Revised Wording: j. Expenditures in excess of three-hundred dollars (\$300) must be approved by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETING OF MEMBERS

Current Wording: d. A quorum is required for any Chapter Membership Meeting; a quorum shall consist of at least one third (1/3) of the Chapter Members in person or by proxy but not less than 10 Chapter Members.

Revised Wording: d. A quorum is required for any Chapter Membership Meeting; a quorum shall consist of at least one quarter (1/4) of the Chapter Members in person or by proxy.

Current Wording: e. Proxy votes must be presented to the presiding official prior to the meeting being called to order.

Revised Wording: e. Proxy votes must be presented to the presiding official prior to the vote being counted.

ARTICLE X - ELECTIONS

Current Wording: a. Acceptance of nominations for candidates will be opened at the September meeting and will remain open until the start of balloting at the October meeting.

Revised Wording: a. Acceptance of nominations for candidates will be opened at the September meeting and will remain open until the start of balloting at the November meeting

ARTICLE XI - COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. - Standing Committees

Current Wording: The President shall appoint a member of the Chapter in good standing to carry out the duties of the Standing Committees. These shall include, but not be limited to, the office of Newsletter Editor, Publicly Chairman, Social Director, Program Chairman, Membership Chairman, and Fly-In Coordinator.

Revised Wording: The President shall appoint a member of the Chapter in good standing to carry out the duties of the Standing Committees. These shall include, but not be limited to, the office of Newsletter Editor, Membership Chairman, Website Chairman, Young Eagles Coordinator, and Tool Librarian.
