The February meeting was held at DeWitt Spain Airport in the CAF hangar. This was the first meeting of the chapter in their beautiful facility and it was a great opportunity for everyone to see the unique airplanes hangared there and discuss them with members of the CAF. We had a good number of new guests attend the meeting with 5 of those guests joining our chapter.

Welcome to EAA Chapter 182!

President Gerhard Schubert opened the meeting by greeting guests and introducing our new newsletter as well as the man behind the scenes who creates it, Alan Howell. Thanks, Alan, for a great job. Gerhard also thanked Cameron Bunting for the improvements made to the chapter webpage. A new add-on to the website is the tool loaner list where you can borrow special tools you might need for your project.

The new "182 Flyer Marketplace" made it's debut in the first newsletter with a big list of parts from Gary's Starduster Too.

Gerhard informed the members about EAA's Ray Aviation Scholarship fund that is now available for future student pilots to cover the cost of flight training up to \$10,000 dollars. If any member knows of someone who would be eligible or interested, please contact Gerhard for application details.

Tech counselors Dwight Smith and Gerhard Schubert had no new inspection reports to announce, but we urge you to use this service so you have additional documentation for your build project as the FAA/DARs like to see these.

Progress was reported on Eddie Brewer's Skybolt project which was featured in the first edition of the newsletter.

Gerhard Schubert gave a presentation about the new "EAA Flight Test Manual." This manual was developed by EAA to give builders and pilots a logical sequence of activities using 18 checklists to understand and verify structural and performance limitations, flying qualities of a plane, and a pilot's proficiency and readiness to fly it safely.

Based on requirements of FAA AC90-89B and AC90-116, the Flight Test Manual gives you a tool to go through Phase one step by step. It guides you through flight testing and at the end, after collecting all necessary data, you will be able to create a POH specific to your plane since you are the

manufacturer. This will also be an important resource for other pilots who will eventually fly your plane. Overall, creating and keeping records will add value to your plane as it records important information for other people like insurance companies and perspective buyers. And last but not least, it is a huge benefit for flight safety.

The next meeting will be announced soon as we look into holding a workshop at Gerhard's hangar at Charles Baker Airport about basic avionics wiring.
