Warren Roosen was a P-51D Mustang pilot during the Korean War. He flew 363 (yes, three hundred and sixty three) ground attack missions on and near the 38<sup>th</sup> parallel. Warren served from November, 1952 through August, 1953 at an airbase in South Korea less than 50 miles South of the front lines. He flew as many as 5 missions a day! ## S.T.E.M. In Flight

Wednesday, March 19, Jack Brewer, Steve Helinski, Kristopher Piotrowski and Dale Hagen attended the S.T.E.M. Tech Talk at the Kent Aviation Center at the Kent County Airport. The intended audience was as 4th through 12th grade teachers. Also in attendance were quite a few 11th and 12th grade students from all over the county who are in the aviation maintenance and avionics programs housed at the airport hangar.

The event featured 10 minute talks from aviation industry professionals that focused on the real-world application of S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Electronics and Mathematics) disciplines in the field of aviation as a means of giving the teachers a way to excite and inspire their students. Speakers included **Richard Foster** from EAA Chapter 145 who spoke on electrical requirements for LED lights for aircraft, **Susan Arthurs** of Blue Skies Ideas who shared lots of sources for learning materials in the field of Aerospace, **Kevin Nelson** of Nelson Aerodynamix who spoke about Employability Skills, **Mario Atias** from GE Aviation who spoke on 21st Century Aerospace, **Wayne Kleckler** GE Aviation who spoke about Frontier Avionics, **William Tramper** of L-3 Avionics who gave an inspiring talk about the future of aviation, **Ginger Devillers** from the West Michigan Flight Academy shared video of students involved in WMFA and their successes in reaching young people, and **Joe Hass** who talked about Unmanned Aerospace Systems and demonstrated several small UAVs.

In the afternoon teachers and students met separately with organizers, speakers, and volunteers (like the four of us) to brainstorm. The result was the following "RAVE reviews."

Teachers: "Now, THIS is a great PD (Professional Development)" "Wow, that was neat!" "We really need to have these conversations"

Students: "I wish this was all day!" "That was cool!" "Can we do this again?"

Ebiri Nkugba of the Kent Intermediate School District says they will do this again next year. Maybe some of you would be interested in participating. I can say it was a lot of fun.
