EAA Chapter 211 Meeting Minutes – 2015-05-01

Attendance: 25

Call to order and Pledge of Allegiance – 19:30

The May 1st meeting was called to order by President Tom Marotta. Twentyfive members (zero guests) were in attendance.

Previous Meeting Minutes:

A motion to approve the May 1, 2015 meeting minutes was made and seconded. The motion unanimously passed.

Treasure's Report:

We had receipts in June of \$9.50 Coffee Fund and \$25.00 dues for a total of \$34.50 We had \$100.00 of expenses in June (Jason Petroelje Memorial Donation). The checkbook balance from the last meeting was \$4,216.14. Petty cash balance at last meeting was \$82.00. This gives us a checkbook ending balance of \$4116.14 and a petty cash ending balance of \$116.50, for a total Chapter 211 current meeting fund balance of \$4,232.64.

2015 Budget Summary - Update

Expenses projected to be \$1,593.00. Receipts are at \$1,477.00.

A motion to approve the treasure's report was made and seconded. The motion unanimously passed.

Local Chapter Information, Business, and Dates:

We now have 47 chapter members. This compares to 58 members last year and 64 members the previous year.

Some of you have not yet provided your EAA membership number – we need for EAA records. Please get your number to Secretary/Treasurer, Earle Bares, asap.

It was noted we still are in need of a Flight Advisor. A Flight Advisor is an experienced pilot who has successfully completed first flights of amateur built aircraft, who helps evaluate & prepare other pilots to safely complete first flights of their newly completed aircraft. Dan Bauman indicated that Sparta Chapter 704 needs help on August 15, 2015 for their Fly-in (this is the same day as our picnic, unfortunately).

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to repair the video projector. See more information about the projector at the end of the minutes on page 3.

Young Eagles:

A motion was made to set the date of September 12, 2015 for the Young Eagles Event. The motion was seconded and approved by the membership. Kevin Golsch, the YE Coordinator was not at the meeting, but it was reported that he is expecting 120 to150 kids. Tom Marotta outlined in general the manpower required. We also will be promoting this event at the Dawn Patrol on August 29, 2015, and will need volunteers both for the day of the event (Pilots and Ground Crew) and for the promotion and registration booth at the Dawn Patrol.

Program: Fly Q, by Seattle Avionics

Our June meeting featured our first "Live Webinar". The guest speaker, Keith Russo, of Seattle Avionics, came to us from the West coast, via the "web" and two cell phones (one for video and one for audio), and a video projector generously provided by Tom Marotta, because the color wheel in the chapter's video projector exploded the night before during testing of the technology in advance of the webinar.

Seattle Avionics is a company that was formed more than 12 years ago and is the oldest independent aviation software company. They began with making the award-winning Voyager Flight Software System for Windows that helped pilots create flight plans faster and easier than every before. They later expanded into selling their brand of US and European aviation data, ChartData ™, to more than 20 major aviation companies worldwide like Bendix-King, Aspen, Dynon, and more (Grand Rapids Technologies is one of the users of their software). With the coming of the Apple iPad, they saw the writing on the wall and invested heavily in getting their ChartData into virtually every major portable device. They later partnered with AOPA to create the #1 rated major aviation app for the iPad - FlyQ EFB.
