The meeting was adjourned at 21:30 Following adjournment, several members enjoyed pizza and conversation at Clover Bar.


Prez Sez continued

Chapter 211 January Survey Results

I want to thank the 26 members who participated in our first online survey. Your responses have provided insight into your interests and given the Board, and our new President, Mark Lynn, some direction in how, or where, to lead Chapter 211 in the future.

I know some of you are curious about the results of the survey, so I thought I'd share them here:

1. How many years have you been a member of Chapter 211?

One year	7.69%	2
Two years	7.69%	2
3-5 years	7.69%	2
Over 5 years	76.92%	20

2. Do you think that increasing membership should be a goal of our Chapter?

3. How important to you is the subject matter at our monthly programs?

4. What program subject matter and topics you would like to see more of?

The most frequent answers involved the following: How-to (flying, instruments, radios, navigation), Technology, Building Techniques for Experimental Aircraft, Flying Adventure Trips & Camping, Build Reports, Trip Reports, and Project Visits.

5. What do you like about Chapter

Most respondents mentioned one or more of the following: Friends, Making New Friends, Comradery, Knowledgeable Members Willing to Help and/or Share. Also mentioned by a couple of respondents was the fact that 211 has a reputation as being a builders chapter. One comment was, "Great people, nice history, but lets not live in only in the past, the future is so much more interesting." One apparently not-so-content member answered, "Not much right now." But, another another said, "The programs have been much better the last year or two."

6. If there is something you would change about Chapter 211, what would it be?

This question yielded lots of interesting suggestions...here are some: "Focus on how to build and fly, not on business and social." "Don't change a thing." "Get more members involved in Chapter events and projects." "Be more inviting to new members." "Take credit card payments for dues and donations." "Have some 'fly-outs' for

breakfast or lunch, or a camping trip to Fox Island." "We used to bring in guests. I miss that." (WHAT?)

7. Would you be in favor of having social "cookouts" before most of our meetings, in order to raise money (via a suggested donation)?
