Prez Sez

I was 11 years old when my dad, a 30 year old, a high-school educated, blue-collar machinist, earned his private pilot license. Just a year later, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin became the first men to walk on the moon. 'Star Trek,' Lost in Space, and Walter Cronkite's The 21st Century were popular TV programs. The "jet age" and "aerospace industry" had become part of the American lexicon. I, like many children of that era, believed that by time we reached adulthood, almost everyone would be flying their own private aircraft... maybe even in the form of flying cars! Sure, we were young and naive, but the world changed too. Oil shortages, litigation,



regulation... aviation became more expensive and thereby less accessible to the average person. This barrier, and the need for an adequate number of active, general aviation pilots to maintain a sustainable level of economies of scale, are two of the reasons EAA created the Young Eagles Program. Some of those children we fly will be inspired to become tomorrows general aviation pilots. While others may never become pilots, they will carry with them a more favorable attitude about aviation than would otherwise be the case, and be life-long aviation enthusiasts and allies rather than detractors. So I wish to thank those who have been Young Eagles pilots and ground crew volunteers. What you have done, and will do, will produce more good, and good will, than you may ever know. Along with that message I wish to congratulate the Grand Haven Aviation Association on a very successful Dawn Patrol event on Saturday, August 24. The weather was spectacular, which helped, I'm sure, but it was all the diligent work of the volunteers (some who are members of EAA Chapter 211 as well), who truly made it a huge success. Chapter 211 had a "booth" at the event too. A special thanks to Ken Gleason and Brian Gerhardt, who staffed the booth, and Dave Thomas and Brian Green for bringing parts of their build projects to show the public part of what we do. 


