A total of 19 members and 9 visitors were in attendance at the March meeting. We welcomed guest speaker Aerial Photographer Marge Beaver. Visitors also included Joe Stape, Dennis Otto, Deb Krohn, Marlene Capotosto, Darlene Kremers, Ethan Beswick, and young persons Audrey Green and Jacob Lynn.

Previous Meeting Minutes:

After reviewing previous minutes, a motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the February 3, 2017 meeting minutes.

Treasure's Report and the Past Month's Expenses and Receipts:

As a reminder, we ended last year (in budget terms) with about \$3,100. After February receipts of \$278.00 and February expenses of \$542.00, we currently have a balance of \$2905.42 (\$2865.42 in checking and \$40.00 in petty cash). We still have \$235.62 in checks outstanding (not cashed). We have not had time to summarize last year or produce a budget for this year, but expect to do so by next meeting. Motion to approve was made and seconded to accept the treasure's report and was unanimously passed.

Special Announcement:

It was announced at the March 3 meeting that long time EAA Chapter 211 member Phil Michmerhuizen passed away the on March 2. We were all saddened to here the news. Flowers will be sent.

Technical Reports:

Jack Brewer talked about the replacement for 100LL. At least two fuel are being developed by Shell and Swift Fuels (or are developed at this point in time) and are being tested or in use (Shell Oil's Shell UL100 and Swift Fuel's Swift UL102). Swift Fuels' 94UL is already in use. Many piston-engine aircraft with engines that require avgas having a minimum octane rating at or below 94 are now eligible to buy the

...appropriate STC certificates in order to fly the fuel, including: Skyhawk (172 R&S), Cutlass (172 RGs), Cardinal (177s) and Skylane (182s); Piper Seminole, Comanche and Aztec; Beechcraft Musketeer, Travel Air, and Duchess.

Also including: Maule - all Lycomingpowered models; Mooney models A-D and G; and other aircraft models with engines that require avgas rated at or below 94 octine. Aircraft with autogas STCs are already eligible to use the premium 94UL avgas.

Gary Van Farowe was not in attendance and thus no report from him.

Old and New Business:

Young Eagle Flights – Warren Roosen passed around a sign-up sheet for the Young Eagle flights that we will be doing later this year. July 15 and August 12 are the tentatively set dates for the flights. Warren pointed out we need many volunteers and in particular, planes and pilots. As stated, we do plan on limiting the number of flights pending the number of planes we get and will give the kids a quality and unrushed briefing.

Program:

We welcomed guest speaker aerial photographer Marge Beaver to the meeting. She told many interesting stories, but for the most part just showed us the wonderful scenes she has taken and in particular West

Michigan photos. She uses her specially modified Cessna Cardinal N177MB (has a "port" in the floor) to take the photos. She has logged over 7000 hours of time in her 35 year aerial photography career. Over her many years of aerial photographic assignments, she also accomplished publishing three marvelous and spectacular coffee table books, and had copies available at the meeting which several members purchased. From the Editor/President/Webmaster,


