# **Prandlt-D**

#### The Quest for a Safer, More Efficient Wing Design

For March 2022 we welcome Randy Houtman, engineer at Dematic and Newsletter Editor for of EAA Chapter 145, as our guest speaker. Randy's program will introduce us to NASA's Preliminary Research Aerodynamic Design to Lower Drag (Prandtl-D), a project intended to provide for future low-drag and experimental aircraft designs.

The origin of the project's tongue-twisting name, and its acronym, is a reference to early German Aerospace Engineer, Ludwig Prandtl.

For nearly a century Ludwig Prandtl's lifting-line theory remains a standard tool for understanding and analyzing aircraft wings. The tool, said Prandtl, initially points to the elliptical spanload as the most efficient wing choice, and it, too, has become the standard in aviation. Having no other model, avian researchers have used the elliptical spanload virtually since its introduction. Yet over the last half-century, research in bird flight has generated increasing data incongruous with the elliptical spanload. In 1933 Prandtl published a little-known paper presenting a superior spanload: any other solution produces greater drag. We argue that this second spanload is the correct model for bird flight data. Based on research we present a unifying theory for superior efficiency and coordinated control in a single solution. Specifically, Prandtl's second spanload offers the only solution to three aspects of bird flight: how birds are able to turn and maneuver without a vertical tail; why birds fly in formation with their wingtips overlapped; and why narrow wingtips do not result in wingtip stall. We performed research using two experimental aircraft designed in accordance with the fundamentals of Prandtl's second paper, but applying recent developments, to validate the various potentials of the new spanload, to wit: as an alternative for avian researchers, to demonstrate the concept of proverse yaw, and to offer a new method of aircraft control and efficiency. — Quote from NASA Technical Publicaton (TP) Document ID 20160003578

It is "Responsive," meaning, it will respond to changes in width of a browser window by fluidly adjusting the placement of elements on a web page to best fit the available space. In other words, it should work pretty good with your tablet or smartphone. However, I noticed a little distortion in some pictures on my phone, but there is a desktop setting you can select that gives you the exact image you would get on a desktop, shrunken down to fit your screen. To find that setting, touch the three little dots in the upper right portion of your screen and check "Desktop site" in the menu that drops down...at least that's how it works on my Samsung phone.

There is still a little more work to do on the website, but it is useful enough in it's present state to bring it out now. I will be adding some pictures to the galleries, and you might notice some slight changes to the navigation choices on the left side as thinks get figured out.

# February's Meeting

The unusually low attendance at our February 2022 meeting (just 8 people), presented a timely opportunity for what turned out to be a surprisingly constructive dialogue concerning shrinking attendance and the slowly declining membership that Chapter 211 has experienced in recent years.

One might hope for a miracle solution, one simple answer yet to be discovered...some dramatic change we can make that will turn everything around. But an analysis of what we uncovered in our discussion reveals a complex mosaic of influencing factors. The vexing thing is that while some of these factors can be remedied through greater diligence and shared commitment, others are completely beyond our control!

- 1. Weather / Time of Year This is the time of year that can make even the hardy wince at venturing out. It's cold. The roads are slippery. The wind is howling, and visibility is sometimes nonexistent. It is so bad that some of our regular members simply leave and go South for a few months.
- **2.** Aging Membership Guys are getting older, some to the point they are giving up flying, or, sadly, dying.
- 3. As membership declines, so do the dynamics that make membership attractive. How? People want to belong to Chapters that are active, vibrant, and fun. Programs, activities, and fun require input and implementation by dedicated, enthusiastic volunteers who are fired up, not burned out. When membership declines, naturally, volunteerism declines, and an ever increasing share of the load of running the organization falls to fewer and fewer volunteers. There can be no doubt that for any organi-

zation to survive, it must continually attract new members!

**4. COVID-19** – Not only concerns about transmission, but all the protocols, masking, physical distancing, seating capacity limits, etc., created many difficulties and frustrations in trying to schedule programs weeks and months in advance, when some-



times we didn't even know if we would be allowed to have a meeting, or whether anyone would attend.

- **5. Friday Night Meetings** Some guys have told us Friday nights are difficult for them to attend, but it's hard to determine what night/day/ time would be better. Somebody's going to have a problem with whatever day or night we choose to meet.
- 6. The Internet Literally EVERY-THING is available on the Internet. Many of the reasons chapters became so popular in years and decades past can now be easily satisfied online, any day or night of the week. Builders' Forums and groups who build and fly the same make and model of aircraft, can and do find each other for answers and support, not just from somebody within a 50 mile radius, but from all over the country, or anywhere the world! Pilots used to build from scratch or from plans. Today, most are building

from kits, and many of the manufacturers offer fast-build options and tech support. So, the Internet is supplanting some of the traditional functions of Chapters.

7. Losing Members to More


Dynamic Chapters – We discovered that a few guys that used to be active in our chapter have joined EAA Chapter 704, in Sparta. Some drive, or fly, much farther to go there than to come to Grand Haven! In recent years, Sparta Airport has become a happening place. Several large corporate hangars have been built by some guys who are active in 704, and a lot of active building of airplanes is occurring on-site, creating much interest and excitement. 704's IMC Club is also a big attraction for some.

There may be more reasons than the seven listed here, but think about this; two years ago, before the Covid pandemic, we were down to an average attendance of 24 to 28 per meeting. For most meetings after March 2020 but prior to February 2022 (when we could have them), we were having a minimum attendance of 12. If we lost an average of just two attendees for each of the reasons acknowledged here, it would put us right about at an attendance of 12.

Conclusion – Some of these issues will eventually resolve themselves. The weather will soon warm up. "Snowbirds" will return. The Covid pandemic will pass. Good meetings and good speakers will be found and booking them will become easier. New ideas to rejuvenate and inspire our Chapter will be implemented. Attracting new members will bear fruit. With effort, creative ideas, and your help, we will survive this present low cycle.


## **Survey Results**








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
# Would you be willing to give a program (or host a visit) about your project/build?





Of the following choices, which (if any) would be unlikely or impossible for you to participate/attend?







If you were out of town, or home ill, or just quarantining, would you have any interest in viewing a Chapter 211 meeting online (for example, via Facebook Live)?







I made a couple of mistakes with this survey. The first was on Question 6 (Q6). The Saturday answer was supposed to be Saturdays, 9:00am, just like the answers in Question 5, not 7:00pm. I hope people caught that and understood it was a typo, otherwise the results would make question 6 pretty much invalid.

The second mistake, if you want to call it that, is with Question 10. I regret not asking the respondents who answered "No" why they answered as they did. All we can gather from this question is the fact at least three members do not intend to renew their membership this year. To know why would have made this question much more informative and educational.

Another important note. Although some would say that a .545 response rate (24 replies out of 44 surveyed) is pretty good, it is possible that if the other 20 had responded, they might have drastically altered the results. Statisticians might counter that additional respondents would likely have reinforced the surveys results. I suppose that is possible as well, but we'll never know!
