October... Time to enjoy color tour flights. The newsletter deadline is too early for a report on the trip to the Air Force Museum. I am sure that it will be discussed at the meeting



Earlier this month I took a vacation to Washington DC. One of my stops was the Smithsonian Air and Space

Museum. I had last been to Washington, and the museum, in 1981. It was interesting seeing the Wright Flyer, the Spirit of St. Louis, Apollo 11 capsule. This time I also got to see some aircraft that I had been closer to, SpaceShipOne and especially Voyager. In 1985 I was out at Mojave and talked my way into the Voyager hangar on a day it was supposed to be closed; I spent an hour or so talking to a retired Rockwell engineer working on the project. He let me get up close and personal with the plane. He also moved the wing tip up and down until he found the frequency that would make both wings move way too much. I also saw the rear cowl and figured out that the rear engine would be water cooled before the news was supposed to be released. I agreed to keep the secret. Interesting stuff for a young engineer.





RV-8 PROJECT NEEDS FINISHING!

Hurricane Katrina changed my life and caused events that have sapped my enthusiasm for working on my RV-8 project. Having just reached the age of 67, I have realized that my building skills will not allow me to finish this project alone in a time frame that will allow me to fly it before I lose my medical. Therefore, I would like to either sell the project or hire someone with good building skills to finish it.

Most metal work has been accomplished and all components have been primed. The fuselage is a fast build kit. The wings and tail are virtually completed. I have a brand new Superior IO-360 engine for power. I am looking for either someone who would like to buy the project or someone who would like to finish it for compensation. I have a nearly new cargo trailer into which I can deposit the entire project and take it to a buyer or a builder. I can also be available to work on it – particularly when another set of hands is needed. Finishing it in Michigan will require a suitable workshop that doesn't cost me an arm and leg.

If you have any interest in discussing either, please contact me, so we can talk about it. If you are a prospective buyer, I will be looking only to recoup my out of pocket cost and no compensation for all the labor previously invested. For the prospective builder, I will front all material and equipment costs and make progress payments for your labor, but I will want to set an agreed price once you have had a chance to evaluate the remaining workload.


