

I can still use stories and photos from Sun'n fun.



EAA Ford Tri-Motor Fact Sheet

199 Aircraft built...this is number 146... birthday August 21, 1929... began life with 300HP Wrights...converted to 450HP Pratt & Whitney in 1949.

Fords birthed commercial aviation. First scheduled Passenger & Cargo flights were in Tri-Motors (at Ford Field in Dearborn, MI). TWA, Eastern, Pan Am, Northwest, American & Western all had Fords in the beginning. Production on Tri-Motors lasted from 1927 – 1931 because Douglas & Boeing came out with faster aircraft (DC-2 & B-247). Most Fords ended up with developing countries due to their remarkable short field/high payload capability.

EAA's Ford together with its sister ship NC 8408 founded Eastern Airlines in 1929. Two (2) years later it was leased to Cubaña where it flew the inaugural flight from Havana to Santiago de Cuba. In August, 1946 it was sold to the Dominican Republic & became their "Air Force One". In 1949 it was imported to Miami where the larger engines were installed. In February, 1950 it became a crop duster in Arizona. From August, 1955 until May, 1958 it was owned by Air Service Co. of Boise as a Borate Bomber fighting forest fires. Johnson Flying Service bought it to use as a smoke jumper aircraft. The lower 1/2 of the Cabin Door was squared off to facilitate the



parachute operations. In March, 1963 the Ford was sold to LeMaster Glenn Aerial Spraying Service to use as a crop duster. Dale Glenn bought out his partner in July, 1964. In late '64 he leased it to Tallmantz Aviation in Santa Anna for use in the movie 'The Family Jewels' starring Jerry Lewis. When that lease was completed, Dale used the airplane for the next 9 years as a barnstormer, hopping passenger flights around the U.S.

On June 16, 1973 while at an event in Burlington, WI, the airplane was severely damaged by thunderstorm winds while tied down. EAA bought the wreckage and spent 12 years restoring the airplane. On July 20,1985 the airplane made its post restoration flight. Since 1985 Ford NC8407 has been flying on behalf of its owner, EAA at Pioneer Airport in Oshkosh, at the annual EAA AirVenture and also at various outreach programs in cities throughout the Midwest.

Old Business:

Tom M. discussed the ford trimotor visit to MKG that is scheduled for July 15, 16, 17, 18, with departure on the 19th. We will need many volunteers in several areas a sign-up sheet will be at the next chapter meeting.

Ben Ennenga reported that the dawn patrol/breakfast scheduled for June 20th has been cancelled by the Grand Haven Lions Club. Our chapter participated last year by parking airplanes.

The joint chapter bus trip to the Museum of The United States Air Force located in Dayton, OH is coming together. It is scheduled for September 24 and 25, 2010. Cost is now finalized at \$46.00/ seat (round trip) for the bus, and motel cost of \$47.00 each(double

occupancy), including all taxes, for Friday night. A more detailed handout will be available at the May chapter meeting. Bring your checkbooks as Walt Clawson will be receiving payments at the meeting. Remember, we need to fill the 55 passenger bus, so bring children, wives, grand children, friends.

Oshkosh connection: we need someone to step up and volunteer to put together a simple listing of chapter members that will be attending OSH this year. To include dates of attendance, cell phone numbers, where staying, driving or flying and when, etc. so we can hook-up if desired.

New Business:

Tom Marotta is hosting a project visit at 10:00AM on Saturday, May 22nd. We will be seeing his Velocity FG and he will be powering it with an O-360. More details at the next meeting. Let's all turn out to show our interest and support for a fellow homebuilder.

coffee and cookie break was a power point presentation and talk by Jim Vantine and Paul Albrecht, both veteran FAA air traffic controllers from Grand Rapids TRACON. The subject was the co-location of four West Michigan radar approach facilities(GRR, MKG, LAN, AZO) to a new building at Kalamazoo. Highlights: no controllers at GRR, LAN, MKG, all will be seated at AZO; loss of controller local knowledge; less safe for VFR pilots. It will not save the FAA any money because more controllers will be needed in total (tower and TRACON), also new buildings will need to be built.
