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EAA Chapter 211 Meeting Minutes – 2017-05-05

Attendance: 21

Call to order and Pledge of Allegiance:

The Friday, May 5, 2017 Chapter 211 Meeting was called to order at 19:35 by President Dale Hagen.

Attendance and Visitors:

A total of 20 members and 1 visitor were in attendance at the May meeting. We welcomed visitor and now new member Rich Guilfoil to the meeting.

General Comments and Update:

Dale welcomed everyone to the May meeting. Dale explained the purpose of this meeting was to discuss various ideas to attract new members, revitalize, and grow Chapter 211, and ultimately chart a path for the future of our Chapter. Dale also stated that he should be at all the future meetings this year.

The presentation of a very detailed scale replica of the 1935 American Eaglet was made to Gary Van Farowe for his dedicated leadership and substantial involvement with the "full size" Eaglet project. We thanked Gary for all he did on the project and several members stated their heart felt appreciation.

Previous Meeting Minutes:

A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the April 7, 2017 meeting minutes.

Treasure's Report and the Past Month's Expenses and Receipts:

After April receipts we had a net of \$23.00 added to our funds and expenses of 50 cents. We therefore currently have a balance of \$3025.92 (\$2953.42 in checking and \$62.50 in petty cash). We do have a Young Eagles event label expense of \$29.00 yet to be paid. It is noted, per our 2017 budget and again what is anticipated, we would end the year with a balance of around \$1850.00.

A motion to approve was made and seconded to accept the treasure's report and financial statements. Motion was unanimously passed.

Local Chapter Membership and Dues:

As of the May meeting we had 30 paid members and as of the writing of these minutes we have 34 members. We still need some member's EAA membership numbers. Please note any corrections or new information you want added to our "data-base".

Technical Reports:

Jack Brewer: Jack talked a little about rebuilding a Champ and the crash of an airplane in Mukilteo, Washington. The plane was forced to land and upon descent, it clipped electrical wires and this in turn ignited a massive fire ball. Jack also stated the Wings of Mercy event in Muskegon will take place June 10 and a Muskegon Airshow may take place on August 24.

Old and New Business:

Young Eagles - July 15th (in conjunction with an airport open house) and August 12th (in conjunction with Dawn Patrol) are the set dates for the Young Eagle flights. Warren Roosen indicated we so far have 5 planes and pilots. Warren pointed out we still need volunteers and, in particular, more planes and pilots. As stated, we do plan on limiting the number of flights pending the number of planes we get and will give the kids a quality and unrushed briefing and ride. We have received the specific insurance for the event indicating the event dates which is in conjunction with the current insurance policy on record.

Projects - There an extended discussion about "Chapter 211 helping out around the airport," as well as past agreements made with the airport and/or City of Grand Haven and Chapter 211. The painting of our club house hangar roof now seems to be off the table, mainly due to safety and liability concerns. The painting of the fuel tank remains as a possible project. Earle Bares will prepare a more detailed list of potential jobs we might be able to help with.

Events - An Airport Open House / Aviation Day will take place at the Grand Haven airport on Saturday July 15, 2017.

The Grand Haven Dawn Patrol will be on Saturday August 12, between 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. GHAA is planning on breakfast and hot dogs.

An Aviation Career Education (ACE) Camp will be held next summer at the airport on July 9th through July 13th (2018).

Parking - Earle Bares reported that we can no longer park on the tarmac or by the maintenance hangar any more. He will provide a parking area layout at the next meeting. Earle also stated the Grand Haven airport will become a no smoking campus sometime soon.

Survey - Before the break, Dale Hagen passed out a Chapter 211 Survey and asked that each one of us it fill out.

Coffee Break / Social Time

Program:

After the break, Dale lead a discussion seeking ideas from members about what to do about the 40% decline in membership over the past 5 years. Many, but not all, membership organizations are having similar problems with declining membership. Dale talked about the difference between the causes that are beyond our control and the ones that are within our control, and how we need to try to identify them, then implement the things we can do to reverse the trend. Many concerns were expressed and ideas shared by pretty much everyone in attendance.

Toward the end of the meeting Dale reviewed the following six points of a plan he is proposing.

1. Endeavor to book quality, compelling, relevant programs.

2. Endeavor to stay booked with meetings at least 6 months out so as to be able to advertise programs in advance and to show value in being a Chapter 211 member.

3. Create a brochure that highlights the benefits of becoming a member of Chapter 211.

4. Form a Membership Committee whose job it shall be to A. make sure every visitor feels welcomed, and C. invite them to join Chapter 211.

5. Utilize EAA's membership database to invite EAA members in the area to join Chapter 211.

6. Come up with some ideas for special programs or events designed to showcase Chapter 211 to people who might decide to join us.

Dale concluded with asking that all members please share any ideas they may have, and also, if they felt too rushed, to complete the survey at home and send it in or bring it to the next meeting.

Adjournment:

Meeting was adjourned at 2200 hours.

SAFETY IS PRIORITY ONE continued....

Because loss of control in flight has been one of the most significant causes of fatal aircraft accidents for many years, it has become a major focus of the FAASTeam. Loss of control can occur any time an aircraft enters a flight regime which is outside its normal envelope thereby introducing an element of surprise for the pilot and flight crew. Mr. Heiter will discuss typical causes of LOC accidents and how to avoid them. Time permitting, other topics of interest may be covered such as "BasicMed," the new medical category which became effective May 1, 2017, and the implementation of NextGen and how ADS-B rules are likely to affect us.

This is going to be a great program, and we will likely have quite a number of guests. This is a chance to put forward our best and show what Chapter 211 is all about.
