

Two First Flights were Noted.


Nearby sister Club Activities were presented. Chapter 145 will host an event at Riverview July 8 and 9th.

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replace the traditional vacuum system, to upgrade, and more!

4) Horizon HX; a High Resolution Screen just recently completed and demonstrated for the first time at the most recent Sun - N - Fun (The newest Unit.) We call it the Wide Screen.

Comments and Dialogue from the meeting about the various screens.

Anyone who has our earlier system can up-grade to the larger, brighter screen for about \$800.

The Sport is our No. 1 selling unit. It costs just \$400. dollars more than our nearest competitor But on the maps you request, it minimizes the features to the right and left of your target view, for example - the runway making it simpler to read and focus. The Garmin 430 already gives you the side view of lakes roads and trees etc.

We have the JEP View and the VFR Charts which can be downloaded for free and get viewed in real time. They are geo synchronized. They tell me where I am right now with the position of the plane figure on the screen.

If you buy two of our screens, they



come with dual AHARS that can be used to break the tie between the data elements so that If one should fail you still have your turn indicator, altimeter, and other familiar data as a back up to fly from. Practice is the key.

AHARS means, attitude, heading and reference system.. We designed it. We use a 6 pack system thrown

into one that doesn't read separately. The result is that it tells you your level, bank and pitch you're in right now. We tested a bunch of combinations by flying around with them in place. Ours Works under all conditions. It's What We Do Well!

There was much more interesting information given by these guys!

Also, I sat over 20 ft from the screens, then moved to the back of our brightly lit clubhouse to reveal that ALL screens were equally sharp at those distances and condition.

I'm impressed!
