#### **Prez Sez**

Just because you do something twice doesn't necessarily mean it is easier the second time around. I have written this



edition of "Prez Sez" twice; once this morning on my work computer, the second time at home. I usually copy my work to a memory stick before I leave my office for the day. I didn't copy it this time. So, I'm here, late at night, past the deadline of the newsletter editor, and retyping it from memory. I guess that's a danger of relying on technology.

Ironically, this column is about how technology has changed in the last 20 years or so, making our lives at least different, if not better. I probably would have used a large floppy disk 20 years ago instead of the small memory stick.

Copying my work to a memory device is pretty much the same as it was in the past. What is different is the technology we are using in our airplanes. We don't have NDBs, LORAN, and some of the older (at least, older than I am) ground based systems anymore. We still have VORs, but the end seems to be near for them, as well. We now have GPS, which, I imagine, will alleviate the student pilot nightmare of learning to/from indicators and course to the station problems, as well as DME slant range, and all those things. I say this is different, because we have moved from ground base systems to satellites. GPS should work in more places in the world. and issues like questionable radio coverage of the station is no longer a problem as it is with a VOR. I have heard that advances in inertial technology may even replace GPS, so navigation will depend only on systems inside your aircraft.

I see more of the world opened up to aviation, because we won't need a nearby VOR to find that lake in remote territories, or we can create our own instrument approaches for our private strips. I also see a day that we may not need any ground based facilities at all (except for buying fuel and airplane service, of course). What if the computers in our airplanes can negotiate landing clearances with other aircraft, or automatically download the weather and whatever else we use to get from the FSS? The downside is that the Geek Squad will need A&Ps on staff or you might need a Microsoft certification on your pilot ticket.

Exciting times, indeed.
