

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EAA Chapter 211 June Meeting Minutes

The June 6th meeting was called to order by President Bob Kenick at 7:32 with the pledge of allegiance. The minutes and treasure's report were approved.

Ben E reported on the 60th anniversary on Father's day. He said set up would be on Friday as it would be a busy time with many activities. The plans are for inflatables, the Coast Guard Heli, RC flyers, antique cars and hot rods, and the trolley providing rides to and around town. A sign up sheet was passed around.

Jason P brought some pictures for Oshkosh. They were passed around.

Jack B talked briefly about the Dawn Patrol in Muskegon and the Wings of Mercy. They served many breakfast.

In the absence of our flight advisor, there were several



questions about the RV6 that crashed in Plainwell and the Airbus that went into the Atlantic. Discussion following suggested that the RV6 may have been doing some high speed passes and tighted a turn and as a result went in. It was mentioned that Airbus

was replacing the pitot tubes and their heaters. There was speculation that they were



giving false readings to the flight controls that caused the crash.

Bill S provided a number of AOPA tapes to vice president Dave A that have a number of segments that can be used for

programs.

Grant Funk from Hooper Bay Alaska was introduced. He teaches high school there and talked about what it was like to live there. One thing he said that really seemed strange was there is no plumbing and the obvious outhouse but there were cell phones and the internet. He is developing an aviation program for the school. It was asked if fuel availability was a problem. At present they fly about 200 miles for fuel and they are looking at ways that it might be brought in by barge. Cost of \$13/gal is the big factor for the latter.

Merlin Terrill presented the program for the evening. He noted that our meeting room was the 1st office for the airport and that that Ottawa County was the

last county seat in the state to get an airport.

As a young boy his first airplane ride was in a Ford tri-motor and he was hooked on aviation. Several years latter, about 1049, he needed \$175 dollars for a quarter share in a Luscomb Silver air that J B Sims was selling.

It was June 1, 1948 that he soloed in a T6. He was sent to Navy ROTC at State. It was an accreted two year program that took only 13 months. The Air Force was formed while he was there and his orders were changed to go to Randolph Air Base rather than Pensacola. He flew the F80 but said he really liked the T33 because it had a better performance due to having a larger engine. The F80's were used as bombers in Korea being replaced as fighters by the F86 Saber jet.

A lot of local history was presented and many connections were made between different businesses and with different people as to the development of the airport and its facilities.
