President Bill welcomed 2 guests who were interdicted and signed the Guest Book. He gave recognition and awards to our outstanding leaders before turning over the gavel to our new 2008 President, Paul Overbeek



President Paul started his reign of office by leading us in The Pledge of Allegiance. He directed us to remember that tomorrow morning Bill Vandermolen will host our first Shop Visit to see his WagAero 2+2. Directions were reviewed. No Young Eagles or Flight Advisor Reports were available. Tech Counselor Jack Brewer gave an update on inspections. His advice is to, "keep up on your expiration dates and renewals. That alone can "buy" you a lot of joy." Jack also noted that an Italian Historical Society had heard about Jason Petroelje's 1917 Macchi Flying Boat replica flight, showed interest, and will soon make contact.

News: Several Shop Visits are possible this year due to lots of building taking place.

Chet Uncapher gave a synopsis of the upcoming 2008 Michigan Air Tour centered this year at Sparta. It's a social event reaching back to 1939. It's mission is to promote awareness of how important Airports are to the Community. Last years focus was Endangered Airports, this year it's Airport Growth. The Tour will include a number of airports across Michigan all the way up to Carol in the Thumb. It will finish at Sparta with a banquet at the Radisson in Grand Rapids. Last year 43 planes flew the Tour. "Fight plans accommodate Piper Cub's as well as those 'Speedsters"," says Chet.

Business: 2007 Secretary/Treasurer Gary Moshluk read the Minutes, gave the Financial Report, then officially turned his office over to 2008



Secretary/Treasurer Alfred Smith.

Projects: Ed Schneider – the Dragonfly is coming along. Remember his Video presentation last month.

Paul Dannenberg gave a short video presentation

Bob Vermeulen says his Citroen powered MiniMax passed Inspection in October. Showing videos Bob asked for feedback about the best ways to enclose the cowling around rerouted exhaust pipes.

Paul Overbeek showed his Trio Auto Pilot what will soon replace the TruTrack in his Velocity. An improvement will be a sensor and linkage to the canard.

Bill Scheltema says his autopilot is a godsend sent in his Mustang II, "It holds altitude flawlessly." He showed his aluminum heater box gate that got bent by the incoming ram air. Bill's fix? Make a new one out of stainless! The he showed the new box Scott DeGayner's "like a BD-4" is awaiting a leather interior. It has reconfigured cooling out the side. Now Scott's objective is to paint and accent the plane so that an observer perceives it is a less boxy airplane, "that looks as sleek as it is fast."



Jongsma has a CA65 project, but wanted to fly sooner so he bought a plane. Liability issues were discussed should he sell.

Dan Bauman The RV9 is mostly done, Has a little skirt work and instrument panel yet to do.

Ben Ennenga – His basement is now finished. The plane is an 80 hp Aerobee Sonex

John Gill - is putting an IO360 fuel injected engine in the RV. "Been helping others currently. Am safety wiring a prop. A lesson I learned is keep your parts organized. It saves the building" – spoken calmly, I noted.

Bob - I'm 3 ¹/₂ years into an RV7a

Rocky Frees Jr. – I've already started. It's a Bearhawk,4 place with an IO360

Bill - I'm building a Kitfox. Am waiting on parts, a wingtip a bungee, and nuts from Austria.

Jason Petroelje – I'm working on struts for another. We're baking our own streamlined tubing by adding fiberglass to the original tubing.

Jerome Bush? working on Lee Pitchers Single seat Pietenpol "Sky Scout". Am doing the control cables then will refinish it. Am leaning toward the 5 main bearing 6 cylinder Chevy II engine for it.

Conclusion: some of the rest of us, due to work loads, business priorities, honey-do projects, lack of work space, age related medical factors, etc., sometimes feel at this milestone, "We can only dream and droll" – yet declare with certainty, ---- "Some day"!
